Fast of Tevet, Tuesday, December 18

Asarah B'Tevet, the tenth day of the Hebrew month of Tevet, is a fast day that is observed from before dawn to nightfall. The fasting commemorates the siege of Jerusalem by Nebuchadnezzar II of Babylonia, an event that began on that date and ultimately culminated in the destruction of Solomon's Temple (the First Temple) and the conquest of the Kingdom of Judah.

Fast begins - 6:01am

AM Tefilot - 6:30am

PM Tefilot - 3:50pm

Fast ends - 4:57pm
