

Myrl Weingberg – tuvuga Healthcare Group (THCG) Advisory Board Member

Myrl is the Immediate Past Chief Executive Officer of the National Health Council, the only organization of its kind that provides a united voice for the more than 133 million people with chronic diseases and disabilities and their families and caregivers. Weinberg's extensive career has focused on health care delivery, medical research, long-term care and related issues that affect people with chronic conditions. She has testified repeatedly before Congress and federal regulatory bodies and is a frequent speaker on the patient perspective in health policy.

Currently, Ms. Weinberg serves on the National Institutes of Health NCATS/Cures Acceleration Network Review Board, as a member of the Institute of Medicine Committee on the Evaluation of Research Management by Department of Defense Congressionally Directed Medical Research Programs (CDMRP), and as Chair of the Better Business Bureau Wise Giving Alliance Board of Directors.

Ms. Weinberg also has served on the National Library of Medicine's board of regents' Working Group on Clinical Trials, the Department of Health and Human Services' National Advisory Council for Healthcare Research and Quality, the Governing Board of the International Alliance of Patients' Organizations. The Center for Information and Study on Clinical Research Participation (CISCRP) Board of Advisors, the Brookings Active Surveillance Implementation Council, the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation's Aligning Forces for Quality Program's National Advisory Committee, and the Roche International Science and Ethics Advisory Group.



Ms. Weinberg is a member of the American Society of Association Executives (ASAE) and an ASAE Fellow. She has served on ASAE's Board of Directors, ASAE Joint Finance Committee, and the ASAE Ethics Task Force. Under Ms. Weinberg's leadership, the National Health Council served as a founding member of the Association for the Accreditation of Human Research Protection Programs (AAHRPPP).
