- Receive a poorer quality of care

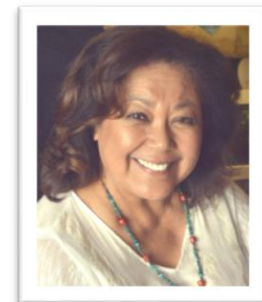
