

# 2<sup>nd</sup> Team What to Expect

## Format

- Crossover start on holes 1 and 10.
- On the pairings sheet (there is a link to it in the 'tee times and groupings' email), you will see that you are in a group with players from 3 other clubs.
- You are playing an individual match against them all. Each of these individual matches consists of 4 games, all net of handicap:
  - Front 9 match play
  - Back 9 match play
  - 18 hole match play
  - 18 hole stroke play
- Each game you win, earns the team 2 points. A tie in a game, earns 1 point. So if you swept everything against all 3 competitors, you would win 24 points.

## At the course

- When you arrive at the course, there will be printouts of the pairings, so you can get the names of your group on a scorecard. You should keep track of everyone's gross score in your group. At the end, you all sign 1 card and turn it in.
- Give yourself enough time to get your group's names on a scorecard and get to your first tee.
- It's up to you if you want to keep track in real-time of the status of all your matches, you are not required, that's a personal preference.
  - If you choose not to keep track, my suggestion for a proper approach is to play every hole like you are 1-up in a match.
- You have to putt everything out, no conceded putts.
- When you are invoking a rule, (i.e. penalty drop) just make sure someone in the group is there to witness and confirm you are doing it correct. Most of the competitors are good guys, rarely are there issues, but I have heard stories of players being very strict. So follow the rules, and ask questions when not sure.
- Yardage measuring devices are OK. And you can share a yardage with another player.

## After the round

- Stick around and socialize with your teammates and competitors.
- You are responsible for posting your score afterwards, it is a T-score.
