Honoring Women—Every Day

I have mixed feelings about a month to celebrate women. Every day, we should celebrate women!! Women make the world go around. There would be no civilization, no people, if there were no women. Giving birth, nursing, nurturing, growing, leading, guiding, training, raising, chastising, encouraging, holding, shaping.

I love women's special ways of being! Alice Walker coined the term *womanist* to describe a "black feminist or feminist of color." She says womanist behavior is "outrageous, audacious, courageous or willful..." A womanist "appreciates and prefers woman's emotional flexibility (values tears as natural counterbalance of laughter,) and a woman's strength."

I was raised by a womanist woman, who was raised by a womanist woman. Ma'dear—Mommy's mommy—was fierce, big-boned, beautiful, smart and as strong as her 12 brothers. When her mother died, she cared for her brothers, all but three older than her. Then she courageously raised three children—two girls and a boy—working as a sharecropper and a nurse's aid. She was audacious in her expectations that they would survive Mississippi, and they did. They survived and thrived.

Mommy is a brilliant, warm, loving, outrageously funny and generous woman. Though she did not go to college (working instead to send her little sister), she nurtured in six children a passion for reading and learning; she tutored us, encouraged us, and stood up



for us in a sometimes unfriendly world. She taught us to love fiercely, to forgive often, to listen carefully, and to tell the truth, all of the time.

Mommy has been fighting Stage IV lung cancer for almost seven years now. She is resilient, she is still here. Mommy is amazing!

I honor my mom this month, and every day, for her impact on my life. I honor the many women in my life—teachers, professors, mentors, friends, colleagues, congregants, artists and authors—who taught me that my womanhood is a gift to myself and to the planet.

We will celebrate women this month at Middle Church with special programming, including a concert on Sunday, March 5, and special guests.

Honoring women every day means standing up for women, standing with women. This means standing in for our rights to earn at least what men do for doing the same job. To have our bodies honored rather than objectified. To make reproductive decisions for ourselves in conversation with partners and in our spiritual communities.

Here's to the amazing ways of women. Excuse me for saying it this way, but you are bad-ass!


Partnership Update
