



Jeannee Worsted Knit Chemo Cap Patterns

A. Lace Brim Chemo Cap

Size: Kids' (Ladies')

Materials: 1 50g ball of Jeannee Worsted; 16" circular needle size #6; set of double pointed needles size #6; and 1 stitch marker.

Gauge: 5 sts = 1" over st st.

Loosely cast on 80 (90) sts onto circular needle, place marker, and join, being careful not to twist the stitches.

Rd 1: Purl.

Rd 2: *(Yarn over, knit 3, slip 1, knit 2 together, pass slipped stitch over, knit 3, yarn over, knit 1); repeat from * around.

Rd 3: Purl.

Rd 4: *(Knit 1, yarn over, knit 2, slip 1, knit 2 together, pass slipped stitch over, knit 2, yarn over, knit 1, purl 1); repeat from * around.

Rd 5: *(K9, p1); repeat from * around.

Rd 6: *(Knit 2, yarn over, knit 1, slip 1, knit 2 together, pass slipped stitch over, knit 1, yarn over, knit 2, purl 1); repeat from * around.

Rd 7: *(K9, p1); repeat from * around.

Rd 8: *(Knit 3, yarn over, slip 1, knit 2 together, pass slipped stitch over, yarn over, knit 3, purl 1); repeat from * around.

Change to st st and work in st st (knit every round) until total length is 5 (6)", ending at the marker.

Begin decreasing on the following round as follows, changing to double pointed needles when needed:

Rd 1: *(Knit 8, k2tog); repeat from * around.

Rd 2: Knit even.

Rd 3: *(Knit 7, k2tog); repeat from * around.

Rd 4: Knit even.

Rd 5: *(Knit 6, k2tog); repeat from * around.

Rd 6: Knit even.

Rd 7: *(Knit 5, k2tog); repeat from * around.

Rd 8: *(Knit 4, k2tog); repeat from * around.

Rd 9: *(Knit 3, k2tog); repeat from * around.

Rd 10: *(Knit 2, k2tog); repeat from * around.

Rd 11: *(Knit 1, k2tog); repeat from * around.

Rd 12: *(K2tog); repeat from * around.

Cut the yarn leaving a 12" tail, thread it through the remaining stitches, draw up tightly and secure. Weave in all ends.

B. Easy Ribbed Chemo Cap

Size: Kids' (Ladies', Men's)

Materials: 1 50g ball of Jeannee Worsted; 16" circular needle size #6; set of double pointed needles size #6; and 1 stitch marker.

Gauge: 5 sts = 1" over st st.

Loosely cast on 80 (90, 100) sts onto circular needle, place marker, and join, being careful not to twist the stitches.

Ribbing round: *(P2, k2, p1); repeat from * around. Repeat ribbing round for 4 rounds total.

Begin pattern:

Round 1: *(P1, k4); repeat from * around.

Repeat Round 1 until total length is 5 (5½, 6½)", ending at the marker.

Begin decreasing on the following round as follows, changing to double pointed needles when needed:

Rd 1: *(Pattern 8, k2tog); repeat from * around.

Rd 2: Work in pattern.

Rd 3: *(Pattern 7, k2tog); repeat from * around.

Rd 4: Work in pattern.

Rd 5: *(Pattern 6, k2tog); repeat from * around.

Rd 6: Work in pattern.

Rd 7: *(Pattern 5, k2tog); repeat from * around.

Rd 8: *(Pattern 4, k2tog); repeat from * around.

Rd 9: *(Pattern 3, k2tog); repeat from * around.

Rd 10: *(Pattern 2, k2tog); repeat from * around.

Rd 11: *(Pattern 1, k2tog); repeat from * around.

Rd 12: *(K2tog); repeat from * around.

Cut the yarn leaving a 12" tail, thread it through the remaining stitches, draw up tightly and secure. Weave in all ends.

Jeannee Worsted Crochet Chemo Cap Pattern

C. Crocheted Chemo Cap

Sizes: Kids' (Ladies', Men's)

Materials: 1 (1, 2) 50g balls of Jeannee Worsted; H hook.

Gauge: Using H HOOK 7 dc = 2".

Chain 4, sl st to first st to form ring.

Round 1: Chain 3, 11 dc in center of ring and place marker in last stitch.

DO NOT JOIN—you will work this in a spiral.

(Increase rounds): You will move marker up to last stitch of each round. *On increase rounds, increase stitch will always be in the stitch where the marker is—if it isn't, you miscounted, go back and check your stitch count.

Round 2: 2 dc in each st around, place marker in last stitch (24 sts).

Round 3: *1 dc in first st, 2 dc*; repeat this pattern around to marker, pm (36 sts).

Round 4: *1 dc in next two sts, 2 dc in next st*; repeat this pattern around, pm in last stitch (48 sts).

Round 5: *1 dc in next 3 sts, 2 dc in next st*; repeat this pattern around, pm in last stitch (60 sts).

Round 6: *1 dc in next 4 sts, 2 dc in next st*; repeat this pattern around, pm in last stitch (72 sts). (Should measure 7" lying flat across.)

Round 7: *1 dc in next 11 sts, 2 dc in next st*; repeat this pattern around, pm in last stitch (78 sts).

For small size: follow instructions up to and including Round 5. Work 5 rows dc in dc around, moving marker to last st in each row. Proceed to edging of choice.

For medium size: follow instructions up to and including Round 6. Work 5 rows dc in dc around, moving marker to last st in each row. Proceed to edging of choice.

For large size: follow instructions up to and including Round 7. Work 5 rows dc in dc around, moving marker to last st in each row. Proceed to edging of choice.

Plain edging

1 hdc in back loop of each st around. Mm.

1 dc in top of each st around. Mm.

1 hdc in top of each st around. Mm.

1 sc in back loop of each st around. Sl st to join. Weave in all ends.

Fancy edging

1 hdc in back loop of each st around. Mm.

1 sc in top of each st around. Mm.

*Skip 2 sc, work (2dc, ch1, 2dc) in next st, skip 2 sc, sc in next st. Continue from * around, working last sc in sc on row below. Mm.

Repeat last row one time more, ending with a sl st in last sc from row below. Weave in all ends.

Abbreviations: Sc—single crochet; hdc—half double crochet; dc—double crochet; st—stitch; pm—place marker; mm—move marker; sl st—slip stitch; ch—chain
