- Kimm Coyner joined REDI Cincinnati in 2014. As the vice president of business development and project management, Kimm is responsible for leading all aspects of an economic development project from business attraction and project management to business retention and expansion. Kimm and her team provide assistance to companies looking to move to or expand in Greater Cincinnati.
- Kimm brings experience in both the public and private sectors to REDI Cincinnati. Throughout her career, Kimm played a pivotal role in Ohio's economic development across multiple cities and counties. Prior to joining REDI Cincinnati, Kimm worked as a consultant advising on economic development strategy and project work for a variety of clients. Before becoming a consultant, Kimm was the economic development director for Warren County, the second fastest growing county in the State of Ohio. During this time, Kimm created the first economic development office in Warren County with direct reporting to the County Commissioners. In addition to leading the department and attracting new jobs and investment, she helped create and staff the Warren County Port Authority as an economic development finance tool.
- Kimm held positions with both the City of Fairfield and City of Mason in economic development roles prior to joining Warren County. Her role at the City of Fairfield was the first full-time economic development position for the City. Kimm created several programs during this time including a business retention and expansion program and a business attraction program.
- Kimm holds an MPA in Public Administration from Indiana University Bloomington and a BA in Political Science from University of Dayton. She is active on multiple boards and leadership councils, including the Cincinnati Zoo Board of Trustees. Kimm was a member of several leadership programs including the Business Courier's 40 under 40, Leadership Warren County and Leadership Fairfield.
