Maryland Heritage Areas Authority Hearing

Request to Enlarge the Boundaries of the Lower Eastern Shore Heritage Area within Wicomico County

CROWNSVILLE, MD – The Maryland Heritage Areas Authority will hold a public hearing at 5 p.m. Thursday, March 23, 2017 on a request to enlarge the boundaries of the Lower Eastern Shore Heritage Area (<http://www.lowershoreheritage.org/>) to include the unincorporated Village of Allen and the connection from the Certified Heritage Area at Nanticoke Road (Route 349/Chesapeake Country Blue Crab Scenic Byway) at Upper Ferry Road in Wicomico County.

The Lower Eastern Shore Heritage Area was certified in 2003. The locally-based Lower Eastern Shore Heritage Committee, Inc. manages the heritage area which is comprised of portions of Somerset, Wicomico and Worcester Counties. Certified Heritage Areas foster partnerships between governments, businesses and nonprofit organizations to promote more livable and economically sustainable communities. They preserve and celebrate Maryland's history, cultural traditions, and natural areas through grants, loans, tax credits and other tools.
