Proverbs 16:9 – In his heart a man plans his course, but the Lord determines his steps.

I like to body surf on the ocean waves. In July my family joined some good friends in Florida, and I was able to ride a few waves. Have you ever done that? I've always done it in the Gulf of Mexico where the waves are a little more manageable. The Pacific Ocean is a little more intimidating – I haven't tried it yet!

It's so much fun. Over the years I've learned how to read the waves, how big they will be, when they will break. Once you find the right wave, you have to go at just the right time, dive in front of the wave, keep your body straight and kick your legs. If it works just right you end up just in front of the wave with a huge rush of energy and it pushes you all the way into shore.

It's a great way to relax and unwind, the waves do most of the work!

Knowing how to catch a wave can come in handy in other parts of life too. It saves so much time and energy if you can latch on to some energy that already

exists instead of having to generate it all yourself. Sometimes we call that momentum. It's easier to talk with your kids about something they are excited about – catch that wave and build your relationship with the energy that is already there! It's easier to sell a product that people are excited about – catch the wave help meet people's needs with the energy that already exists!

It's also easier to carry out God's mission if you can catch a wave that already exists. You know, find issues that people in your community are concerned about and join the cause, address topics and questions that are important to people, run programs that meet people's needs, design facilities that welcome the community.

There is a challenge to catching the wave. You don't want to get so lost in plans and strategies that you forget your mission, the reason you exist. For the Church, that means never losing sight of God's mission – connecting people to Jesus! The church can't change the mission, or the message. But we can be aware of our community, aware of culture and society, aware of the waves of energy!

And we can do our best to catch those waves and ride them!

That's what we will be doing in the next few months as a congregation – trying to find the waves in our church, in our community, in our culture. We will be trying to focus on the gifts, talents, and resources God has given Redeemer, clarify our focus and vision, and align Redeemer to be as effective as we possibly can be to accomplish God's mission in Redwood City!

Focus groups will be conducted.

A demographic study will be complete.

Information about Redeemer is being gathered.

The main source of income for a church to fulfill its ministry goals is offerings. In the 2016-17 fiscal year, Redeemer exceeded its budget projection by 10%, and since December of 2016, Redeemer has seen an increase in monthly giving. This is wonderful news and a

testament to God's people wanting to support His works through Redeemer.

Redeemer has based the 2017-18 budget projection of \$787,000, a stretch goal of a 20% increase, on the desire to increase its ministry outreach and impact in its community. The congregation of Redeemer is being

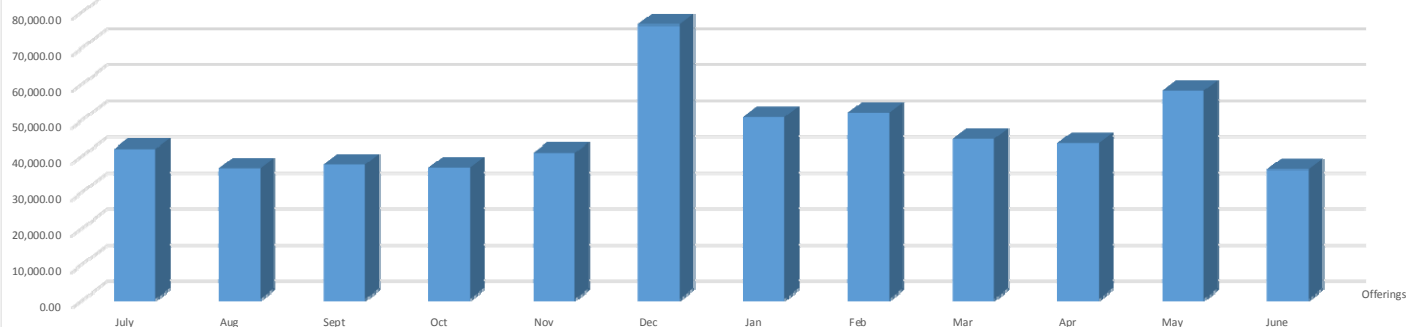
asked to prayerfully consider the their giving in support of the God-led opportunities Redeemer will have to reach Redwood City and beyond in the next year.

Greetings and blessings to you. I am writing to acknowledge and thank you for your recent \$9000 donation to Pastoral Leadership Institute International (PLII). On behalf of those who serve Christ around the world, I want to extend a word of thanks and express our deep gratitude.

PLII recently concluded its training conferences in Tanzania. The second of those Tanzania conferences is pictured below. So far in 2017, **408** have been trained at PLII conferences. Along with Tanzania, PLII conferences have been held in Uganda, Ethiopia, Kyrgyzstan, Russia, and Hong Kong. Conferences are yet to be held in 2017 in Brazil, Latvia, China, Indonesia, Liberia, and another in Ethiopia.



Participants continue to share about the profound impact the training is having on their marriages, their families, and their ministry leadership. As one of the participants in Kyrgyzstan stated, "Sometimes we are focused on secondary things, not on the main thing – God's mission to bring the Gospel to others. PLII has helped me to focus on the main thing again."

On behalf of Dr. Jock Ficken, director of PLI USA, Dr. Norb Oesch, the pastors and spouses around the world, and all the teams of trainers that go out each year to bring the training and learning of PLII, THANK YOU! Joy of Harvest Hmong Language School \$10,000

Joy of Harvest Ministries has been at St Paul's Lutheran Church, Merced, CA for more than 10 years. Their longtime dream of having a Hmong Language School was realized when the pilot program was launched in March 2015. The missional purpose of the school is to reach out into the Hmong community with the Gospel of Jesus Christ. A known delivery system to reach into multigenerational family units is through the children. The school is encouraged by the older generation who want the younger to know their mother tongue. Two important goals are met: 1) to bring back the Hmong language. 2) To plant the seed of the Gospel. All lessons are Biblical material and deliver the message to other generations in the home when the children share it through their homework. The pilot program was every Saturday morning in spring of 2015, and every evening for two weeks in summer. To continue the Saturday morning schedule and expand to 2-3 evenings per week, plus summer events, the ministry needs materials, supplies and support, funded by this grant.
