Life Verse

From Rev. Paul Schult, Lead Pastor

What's a life verse? I'm glad you asked....it's a verse that you have chosen from the Bible which captures in a very personal way for you, what it means to follow Jesus every day.

Many people chose such a verse at the time of their confirmation. Others may land on a verse at a different time in life. Sometimes is might be chosen for a person, or maybe you found it yourself. Maybe the verse captured your heart and attention during a really difficult time in your life, that's pretty common! Or perhaps it came at a time when you felt overwhelmingly blessed by God.

My life verse is Micah 6:8 – it goes like this, “God has shown you, O mortal, what is good. And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God.”

Sometimes I boil it down to this – **Act Justly, Love Mercy, Walk Humbly with Jesus.**

I remember the first time this verse hit me. A new attorney general of the United States was being sworn into office. During an interview a reporter

asked him how he would manage to do such a challenging job. He answered with this verse. For some reason it captured me. That was a long time ago.

Here is how it guides me each day. I am reminded about three things, which really are the most important things in life.

1. Know and do the right thing.

I know I'm a sinner, and I know I will never be able to do the right things with a pure heart. The first part of doing the right thing is admitting my own horrible sin. Every day I remind myself of St. Paul's words – “the worst sinner I know is me.” Asking God's spirit to show me the depth of my sin and my deep need for a Savior is a part of following Jesus. And then I ask the Holy Spirit to help me hold to the truth of what is right in his eyes, to never water it down, to never make excuses for myself, to never rationalize and justify my sin.

2. Love mercy

I love how this verse says to ACT justly – but to LOVE mercy. It doesn't say to LOVE justice. Sometimes we can fall in

love with God's law, especially when we overzealously apply it to other people. God says we should LOVE mercy.

The Bible is pretty clear that the only way we will ever love mercy, is when we realize that God's mercy is first and foremost, for me! When I am overwhelmed by the undeserved kindness that God has shown to me, it softens my heart, and opens the door for me to be gracious and merciful to everyone. This is really another way of saying, love the gospel, love Jesus, love what he has done for you!

May nothing be more precious to me than the good news of Jesus!

3. Walk humbly

Humility – it is the beauty of the gospel. It levels the playing field. It puts every human being on the same level. No one is more deserving of God's love, no one is less deserving. No one gets to boast about themselves, only about Jesus.

No one gets to boast about their good deeds and holy life, because no one is good – so all the religious and moral people can't say they are better than the

irreligious and immoral people.

No one gets to boast about being more compassionate, loving and accepting, never imposing unwanted rules and morals on anyone – so all the irreligious and immoral people can't say they are better than the legalists.

Do you see? No one wins on their own! We all need Jesus!

That's it. That's my life verse. I try to remind myself everyday of these truths from God. I ask Jesus to lead me in his paths – of justice, mercy and humility.

So – what's your life verse? And why?

Generosity in Your Own Words

How did you learn about being generous? Was it your parents who taught you or did you learn it by experience? Did you know that generosity is a gift from the Holy Spirit?

The Apostle Paul references it in his epistle to the Romans, chapter 12.¹ He dictates these words from God, starting with verse 6. *"Having gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let us use them."* Verse 7c informs us that *"the one who contributes, should do so in generosity."*

Generosity is a gift of the Spirit of God and we are to practice it. Whether you learned from a model or not, generosity is a gift that God gives to His Church for our own good and for the good of others.

However you express your generosity, if you had to put it into words, what would you write or say? What would you tell others?

Actions of generosity often speak for themselves. There is another gift that is associated with generosity. In Romans 12:8a God's Word tells us about the benefit of exhortation (encouragement) in generosity. Putting generosity in your own words helps accomplish this encouragement that often, if not always, precedes God's gift of generosity in others.

Have you talked with your family or friends about generosity? This is not to suggest that you brag about it but rather that you *'encourage'* or *'exhort'* those under your care or influence to hear your own witness.
