Rival Eschatology

These concepts of peace, justice, and freedom from enemies were summed up into a single Greek word: sozw, which we usually translate as save. Salvation didn't mean in a spiritual sense whereby I can float off into heaven when I died, but rather that this executed embarrassment of the empire, as he walked out of his tomb, began establishing peace from enemies and justice in the land here and now. God was finally doing in and through his followers what he always promised he would do.

There is a fancy word for this: eschatology. We usually hear this word in the context of the end of the world, but that isn't exactly right. It has more to do with creation being restored to the way it was meant to be - everything in its right place, and the ability for people to breathe a collective sigh of relief because everything is going to be ok.

The problem is that this promise had already been made about 30 years before Jesus was born. Caesar Augustus had ended the long and bloody civil war that ruined the Roman economy and fractured the entire world (from their perspective). When he did that, he ushered in an era of peace and prosperity,

keeping his citizens safe from their enemies and bringing justice to the land. He was proclaimed the savior of humanity - a title he didn't seem to mind. Under his reign, the people of the empire were presented with an eschatology offered by the state. All the elements of sozw applied, so long as you were on the side of the Romans. This was their eschatology. With Rome as the center of the universe, and its ruler proclaimed as divine, those who benefited from Roman rule saw that everything was well. Their savior, Caesar, brought peace.

This is what we call a 'rival eschatology.' Both the Christians and the empire had their own lord who saved them by bringing peace - one through violence and one through sacrificial love - and each ushered into the world a new reality.

As it turns out, this isn't just a nice historical tidbit. Assuming I can count, we get rival eschatologies pushed in our faces every 4 years, and I can't remember a time when fear and anxieties were as high as they are this election cycle. Both elephant and donkey are spending insane amounts of money to tell us that their eschatology -

what it means for America to be set right, have peace and prosperity, and be rid of our enemies - is the only way to go, and if they are not elected, then we are all going to be consumed in apocalyptic fire and poverty where the enemies of the US will trample us to death, puppies and kittens will be outlawed, we will only have one choice of toothpaste, and Christmas will be canceled.

But let me ask this: if the candidate you are so worried about gets elected, does the reality that God has and does raise the dead, both in bodies and our hearts, go away? Of course not. We are called to live by a different eschatology, where all kinds of possibilities open up when we, out of a sense of who God has made us to be, turn to the brokenness around us and live by a different reality. I get that this is a

crazy election, and that the presidential candidates are polarizing and playing into our deepest fears. Certain aspects of our lives could become harder or easier depending on who gets elected (and people can't seem to agree on what or whom will be better), but those are rival eschatologies that, while persuasive or terrifying depending on how you lean, are still being set up to rival the 2000 year story of resurrection and redemption (even if they try to co-opt it into their own campaigns).

No matter what happens this November, we must remember that placing our ultimate hope in the campaign promises of anyone will be to forget that we already have a lord and king who was executed as an enemy of the state and then conquered death itself. Even as I cast my ballot, Jesus is still lord.

For Gift Planning Counselors and Associates

Giving Twice Provides Double Impact

Ever wondered how someone could give all their wealth to the family they love, while at the same time giving all of it to ministries that are special to them?

Such planning is not only possible but affordable! It's often more beneficial than you might realize.

Giving twice can be arranged in several ways. One method is to take out an insurance policy that would pay a death benefit to family members on the life of a donor, or in the case of a couple, on the life of the survivor. The insurance premiums could come from discretionary assets that are often not used by people during earthly life. At death, estate assets are given to ministry while the insurance proceeds replace that entire amount of the estate and goes to family beneficiaries. They are left with cash, free of tax and probate costs.

Another way to experience the impact of "giving twice" is to set up a charitable trust that pays income to family for a period of up to 20 years and then distributes any remainder in a lump sum to ministry. The corpus is invested over that twenty-year period in order to replace the income payments. For example, a five percent income distribution over 20 years will distribute the total amount set aside in a charitable trust and, assuming an annual five percent earnings rate, will preserve the entire original amount for distribution to ministry.

As an additional benefit, the "life income" arrangement detailed above offers a repeating income stream for beneficiaries who may be disposed to spend everything right away. Providing an income flow for certain beneficiaries may bless them rather than bringing the "curse" that their own management could produce.

Whether with created lump sums or structured income over time, charitably minded people have options that result in an opportunity to give twice, doubling the impact of love to family and support for the Gospel.
