STORYTELLING

People love telling stories. Studies show that people love hearing stories. A fellow named Christopher Booker spent thirty-four years researching this and concluded that there are actually only seven basic plots that exist (Overcoming the Monster, Rags to Riches, The Quest, Voyage and Return, Comedy, Tragedy, Rebirth). We just love hearing these storylines over and over again and the details in each version make them meaningful to us personally. Of course, what really matters is how the stories not only entertain us but teach us lessons.

Last year I brought my children to Center Island in Toronto. Both my wife and I had gone there as children (actually, my wife's grandparents went there as children) and it was exciting to bring our own children there. At one particular ride, very young children were allowed to drive a car along a track with many twists and turns. They were in complete control of the vehicles. In a fatherly moment, I asked my daughter how it was that such young children were given such control. Without missing a beat she showed me a tiny guideline that kept the cars on track even if the driver forgot to make a crucial turn. She then went on to elaborate that although we often think we are in the driver's seat, Hashem is truly in control. She said (respectfully) that I had already told her about the cars and the lesson several years ago when I was her third grade teacher.

Minna did not just remember the story, she understood the lesson and immediately applied it when she saw the actual cars. And it wasn't my lesson, if you look in my father's book, he brings out the very same lesson describes how he took me to Center Island as a five year old and observed this lesson.

So we have here not only a story and a common experience but a lesson that remains associated with the story in every one of its incarnations.

That's what Moshe did in this week's parsha. He reviewed virtually the entire Torah, but began by reminding the people of various places. The desert, the Aravah, the Yam Suf, Paran, Chatzeiros... These were the locations where the Jewish people had rebelled ungratefully toward Hashem, threatened to return to Egypt, worshipped the Golden calf, participated in the rebellion of Korach, and listened to the words of the spies. Moshe hinted to these sins and the sin of the golden calf, but he did not elaborate – he left it to the people to remember their own lessons and draw their own conclusions.

Rather than teach the Jewish people new philosophical concepts or explain the enormity of their actions or even explain how to fix them, Moshe chose to simply hint to some of the worst sins committed by the Jews in their travels.

We too, need to develop the ability to learn from experiences in our lives and then to look back and relive those experiences so that we can allow the lessons and inspirations to mold who we are as people.
