

NSF Grant Writing Bootcamp to Reinvigorate Grant Submissions

Internal Deadline: May 29

The Office of the Vice President for Research is hosting a NSF grant-writing bootcamp for investigators with research that is ripe for submission. Participating faculty should be prepared to write a grant during the bootcamp.

Interested faculty are asked to send a prospectus including their demographics and a summary of their planned research to be vetted through their Research Dean for submission to Karin Scarpinato, Ph.D., Associate Vice President for Research.

Procedures for Consideration in the NSF Grant Writing Bootcamp

- 1. Faculty should submit a Prospectus to their respective college administration, with the following information:
 - a. Name
 - b. Department
 - c. College (for our use)
 - d. Sponsor name and I/C or Division the application will be sent
 - e. URL of funding opportunity
 - f. Summary and/or specific aims of their proposed project
- 2. Prospectus' should be vetted through the college. Based on the college administration's recommendations, <u>nominations for participants, including their prospectus</u>, are to be submitted electronically (only) to <u>Karin Scarpinato</u>, Ph.D., Associate Vice President for Research by the deadlines.
- 3. If too many nominations are received, the Division of Research will hold these workshops more than once. To include as many faculty as possible, the Division is planning on holding workshops on our satellite campuses, as needed, and during the semester.
