The Humane Society of Greater Dayton is the area's largest no-kill animal welfare agency. They have been serving the Miami Valley since 1902 and focus on pet adoptions, spay/neuter programs and cruelty/neglect investigations.



How Does It Work?

This program is for Miami Township residents only (unincorporated)

Step 1: Rent a trap from the Humane Society of Greater Dayton. You must put down a deposit of \$75 for the trap, but the \$75 is reimbursed upon returning the trap to the shelter.

Step 2: Humanely trap unowned cats on your property.

Step 3: Call the Humane Society of Greater Dayton at (937) 268-7387 to schedule a time to drop off your trapped cats. Cats must be at least 2 pounds and 8 weeks of age to safely have surgery.

Step 4: The cat will be spayed or neutered as well as ear-tipped, which is the universal sign of an altered stray cat.

Step 5: Feral (wild) cats will be released where they were initially trapped. Friendly cats, if space allows, will enter into the Humane Society of Greater Dayton's Adoption Program.
