Project Leader, Arthur R. Marshall
Loxahatchee National Wildlife Refuge

Rolf graduated from Northern Arizona University with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Forest Management in May 1986. After working for a number of years as a wildland firefighter, air photo interpreter, and forester he was selected for a job with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service as a forester at St. Marks National Wildlife Refuge. Following St. Marks, Mr. Olson moved to Chassahowitzka National Wildlife Refuge Complex as a Refuge Operations Specialist. He then transferred to Carolina Sandhills National Wildlife Refuge as the Deputy Project Leader. In 2002, he became the Deputy Project Leader at the Arthur R. Marshall Loxahatchee National Wildlife Refuge. In 2013, Olson became the Project Leader of the Arthur R. Marshall Loxahatchee National Wildlife Refuge Complex which includes Hobe Sound National Wildlife Refuge. He oversees the operations and budget for both refuges. This includes supervising 16 staff members, approving prescribed burn activities, responding to emergencies, dealing with the public, and oversight of the public use program.
