Following a brief review of the basic ethical principles relevant to healthcare and guidelines for analyzing ethical dilemmas, the audience will participate in discussion of actual ethics cases that have been faced by clinicians and social workers in the work place. The audience will be encouraged to bring their personal experiences, beliefs and values into the discussion and be prepared to consider new or different ways of thinking and resolving the difficult cultural and clinical ethics issues that arise in the everyday practice of social work.
