The On-Line Book Club in Social Work and the Helping Professions recognizes the importance of professionals staying abreast of new ideas, concepts, and findings to advance their practice and their understanding of social issues. The book club occurs on the last Friday of each month from 10:00 AM to 11:00 AM Central Standard Time (CST). Starting in August, 2016 and extending through August, 2017, participants accrue only the expense of purchasing the book selection for a particular month. There is no fee for tuition. Book club meetings occur by conference call each month and are moderated by a member of the faculty of the University of Oklahoma Anne and Henry Zarrow School of Social Work. To receive continuing education credit participants must complete for each session a brief assessment of their reading, and an evaluation.
