With Professor James Godde

Stem Cell research is not new, it has been around since the 1960's, but it has long been fraught with ethical concerns. Most concerns arise from the historic use of embryonic tissue to isolate totipotent stem cells, but a number of developments in amniotic and adult stem cells have helped to alleviate many of these concerns. I will bring you up to date on the latest advances in stem cell research and discuss the important issues that remain concerning the use of these cells in medical treatment.

James Godde received his B.S. in Microbiology from Western Illinois University and his Ph.D. in Biochemistry from the U of I, Urbana Champaign. He then performed postdoctoral research at the National Institutes of Health in Bethesda, MD. He is currently the McGrath Professor of Biology at Monmouth College, where he has worked for the past 16 years.
