The Tow Youth Justice Institute is proud to invite candidates to apply for the upcoming Transforming Youth Justice: A Leadership Development Program, a nine-month program that will begin in March and conclude in November 2017. Candidates will be required to attend each monthly session with some extra-curricular activity between sessions. Sessions will typically be held at UNH campus sites with some sessions held off-site. The 3 content areas integrated within each module of the curriculum include youth justice reform, transformation and best practices, leadership skills and core competencies that will inform the development of individual/group Capstone Project Plan(s).

The goals of the Transforming Youth Justice: A Leadership Development Program are to:

- Build the capacity of present and future leaders as agents of change in youth justice reform.
- Advance leadership development skills and knowledge of best practices in youth justice reform.
- Serve as a resource to the organizations, communities, and systems serving youth through a network of dedicated leaders of reform.

Candidates from Connecticut, employed in positions as mid-level managers and leaders in law enforcement, state and local government, public and private agencies, non-profit service providers, K-12 institutions, policymakers, community leaders, faith leaders, parents, and youth and parent advocates are encouraged to apply for the Transforming Youth Justice: A Leadership Development Program.
