

Art exhibit grows at First of South St. Paul; ends at end of month

First Presbyterian Church of South St. Paul will celebrate communion Sunday, Nov. 25, around a table adorned with artwork from six months of collaboration with the Jewish Women Artists' Circle exploring the topic of community.

Circle member artist Aimee Orkin designed a tablecloth and asked artists to create a unique muslin placemat to form a border around the table. Artist Angela Heider created a ceramic teapot, and a cup for each artist, asking, "What fills your cup?" She then incorporated the responses into the teacups.

The current art exhibit at First Presbyterian features the work of Circle members. The exhibit focuses on the soul, creation, repair of the world, and legacy with an emphasis on the prophetic role in faith, especially as found in the prophets of the Hebrew Bible.

The exhibit, which now includes the tablecloth and tea set, is part of an ongoing effort of First Presbyterian to use art and creativity to deepen understanding between faith-based communities.

The exhibit leaves at the end of November.
