We encounter this fragmentation in our world every day, of course: people who are gracious and kind and generous, and people who are angry, deceitful, intent only on satisfying their own needs; people who are caring and intelligent and well-intentioned, and people whose greed, pettiness, and self-interest make their ends justify any means. To see it so starkly this week,

however, forced me again to confront this question: what do I believe about others? And about myself?

I spent more time than usual on Facebook this week, and more than anything else, I was reminded of this: that my vocation from God is nothing less than to be fully human, where love and grace and “bearing witness” is an act of courage, not of fear; where who we are and what we do brings us closer to this calling, not further away.
