Registration and Payment Details: To reserve your place –

At the Earlybird rate

- First payment: Part 1 deposit of \$195 by ~~July 8~~ **August 19**, 2018
- Second payment: \$1200 (\$700 of which is the Part 2 deposit) by November 4, 2018
(Single supplements must also be paid in full by November 4, 2018)
- Third payment: remaining balance by February 3, 2019

Please note: Earlybird booking provides a discount of \$200. It also allows the deposit to be made in two payments. The total Earlybird deposit is \$895.

At the Regular rate

- First payment: Deposit of \$1095 paid at date of booking
(Single supplements must also be paid in full at same time as deposit)
- Second payment: one half of balance by November 4, 2018
- Third payment: remaining balance by February 3, 2019

Registrations made after February 3, 2019 – payment in full required at time of booking - subject to additional charge and availability

This group will be confirmed when we receive Earlybird deposits for at least 24 full rate participants. Reservations made on first come, first served basis.

Cancellation: Refunds will be made only in line with this policy – no exceptions.

Up to the date of the second payment (November 4, 2018) like-for-like exchanges may be made. If someone who has registered is unable to go they can find someone else to take their place. Such exchanges must be for the same room type – eg a couple who had booked a double room could only substitute another 2 people who want a double room. Every such exchange will incur a fee of \$250 per person. From November 4, 2018 exchanges will no longer be possible.

Times of Worship: This is a custom tour for a church group. We aim to include time for –

- A service of welcome
- Morning prayers on the coach
- Evening devotions before dinner on most days
- Sunday service with a Church of Scotland congregation
- Closing worship

Arrival in Scotland and Tour Departure:

This is a “land only” tour and begins on Monday, May 6, 2019. Travel arrangements prior to that are at your own discretion. Flights into Edinburgh from the US mostly arrive in the morning. There is no program on Day 1 until early evening when we meet for a welcome dinner. You may, of course, arrive a day or two early or choose to stay on after the tour.

Our Itinerary

Day 1 - Monday, May 6: Welcome to Scotland!

Group members will make their own flight arrangements. Arrive Glasgow this morning. Spend the day as you wish and check in to your hotel. Meet your tour manager for an early evening welcome dinner.

Day 2 - Tuesday, May 7: Edinburgh – *The Athens of the North*

With our coach loaded we make the 1 hour drive to Edinburgh. Today we'll have an orientation to Scotland's capital. From the cobbled streets of its Old Town to the Georgian grandeur of the New Town, Edinburgh is a truly beautiful city full of history and full of life. Our guide will walk us back in time but will also explain much about modern living in this vibrant city. We see Greyfriars Kirk and hear about the Covenanters. And we end the afternoon at the very modern buildings of the Scottish Parliament. Then our coach takes us north to Perth in time for dinner.

Day 3 - Wednesday, May 8: St Andrews - *The Auld Grey Toon*

We begin the morning with a guided tour in the magnificent St John's Kirk of Perth. It was here that John Knox preached the sermon which set light to the Reformation in Scotland. We then turn to the east coast and the charming little town of St. Andrews. One of our excellent professional guides will lead a walking tour. St Andrews boasts Scotland's oldest university where many of the Kirk's ministers have been educated. It is a significant site for the history of the Reformation. We see the castle and cathedral ruins. There will also be free time to browse in the stores or maybe walk along the West Sands. Golfers can look longingly at the Old Course. We return to Perth via the Tay Bridge and city of Dundee. Dinner this evening begins with a haggis ceremony, complete with bagpipes and the poetry of Rabbie Burns. And you can taste a little haggis if you wish.

Day 4 - Thursday, May 9: Inverness – *The Capital of the Highlands*

We travel among beautiful scenery today en route to Inverness. We ride the Cairngorm Mountain Railway – an ingenious funicular which takes us all the way to the top. And we make a visit to the Culloden Battlefield Center where we can learn about Bonnie Prince Charlie and the Jacobites. We arrive at our hotel in the center of Inverness, sometimes called "the capital of the Highlands". Stroll out along the riverbank this evening and find a nice place for dinner.

Meals included – breakfast

Day 5 - Friday, May 10: The Great Glen and Inverness

(Today's itinerary subject to ferry times)

We leave Inverness to drive down through the Great Glen and by Loch Ness where we watch out for monstrous events. Near Fort William we see "Neptune's Staircase", an ingenious series of locks on the Caledonian Canal. A distillery visit is also on our program. Our route takes us south past Glen Coe – a beautiful place which witnessed an infamous event in Scotland's history. Arriving in the picturesque west coast port of Oban, we catch the ferry. Less than an hour later our boat docks at Craignure on the Isle of Mull. Here our two group go in different directions.

Group 1 only -

Day 5 – continued:

About an hour by coach brings us to Tobermory. We arrive at our hotel (overlooking lovely Tobermory Bay) in time for dinner.

Meals included – breakfast, dinner

Overnight: Tobermory, Isle of Mull

Day 6 – Saturday, May 11: Iona - A Thin Place

We drive across the single track road to Fionnphort and a short ferry ride brings us to this very special island. It was here in the year 563 that St Columba arrived, establishing the Christian faith in this land. In the language of Celtic spirituality Iona is sometimes described as a "thin place" – where the veil between earth and heaven seems almost transparent. We visit the Abbey and learn about Columba. And we hear about the present day Iona Community. We'll also arrange to have lunch with our friends from group 2. We return to Tobermory for the night.

Meals included – breakfast, lunch, dinner

Overnight: Tobermory, Isle of Mull

Day 7 – Sunday, May 12: Back to the Mainland

(Today's itinerary subject to ferry times)

We pause to share morning worship with a local congregation of the Church of Scotland. Then the ferry takes us back to Oban and we continue on to Glasgow. We'll be passing by the Bonnie Banks of Loch Lomond on the way.

Meals included – breakfast , dinner

Overnight: Glasgow

Day 8 – Monday, May 13: Farewell and Haste Ye Back!

Group 2 only -

Day 5 – continued:

From Craignure this group travels across Mull to Fionnphort. The passenger ferry over to Iona only takes a few minutes and completes our journey. Group 2 will now have a retreat on Iona over 4 nights.

Afternoon of Day 5 (May 10) through Morning of Day 9 (May 14) – On Iona

This part of the program is directed by your group leader. Our tour manager will not accompany you. Accommodation and meals have been arranged as shown.

Meals included –

breakfast and dinner each day (ie 4 breakfasts, 4 dinners); group lunch Day 6 (with group 1)

Overnight – Iona (4 Nights)

Day 9 – Tuesday, May 14: Back to the Mainland

(Today's itinerary subject to ferry times)

After breakfast we take the short ferry over to Fionnphort to be met by our coach. We drive back across Mull to Craignure. The ferry takes us to Oban and we continue on to Glasgow. We'll be passing by the Bonnie Banks of Loch Lomond on the way.

Meals included – breakfast , dinner
