Door-to-Door Scams

Door-to-door scams continue to pose a threat to consumers and businesses in Ontario.

Door-to-door canvassers can use high pressure tactics and can be aggressive in nature.

Consumers may find themselves purchasing a product or signing up for a service which they do not need or want.

Some common door-to-door scams reported to the Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre include solicitations for a charitable donation, an investment opportunity or a service involving the sale or maintenance of water heaters, furnaces or air conditioner units.

Warning Signs — How to Protect Yourself

- Ask for photo identification. Get the name of the salesperson and the name of the company or charity they represent.
- Ask for a breakdown of the charities funds and be sure to get it in writing.
- Never share any personal information or copies of any bills or financial statements.
- Research before you invest. Don't sign anything and always read the fine print.
- If a contract is signed within the home, a cooling off period exists. For example, in Ontario consumers have the right to cancel a contract for any reason within a 10 day cooling off period. There is a 20 day cooling off period for water heater contracts.
- Know your rights. The Provincial and Territorial Consumers Affairs Office, at <u>www.consumerhandbook.ca</u> has guidelines under their Consumer Protection Act (CPA).
