A new approach of healthcare is emerging in this country in which multiple entities work together to better address upstream determinants of health such as the availability of employment in a community; the availability of public transportation; affordable health insurance; access to health care providers; affordable and safe housing; the presence or absence of air pollution; crime; full-service grocery stores supplying fresh fruits and vegetables; and more.

The new approach focuses on population health, and calls for action to improve the health outcomes for all Americans regardless of their gender, race/ethnicity, socioeconomic status, disability status, genetics, sexual orientation, or geography.

“**Introduction to Population Health**” provides an overview of this new approach and its impact on both practice and our healthcare delivery system. This NEW Course developed in partnership with the Connecticut Nursing Collaborative-Action Coalition and the Connecticut League for Nursing, under a grant from the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, is a four-module, online, continuing education course to serve as a primer for nurses, nursing students and other healthcare providers.

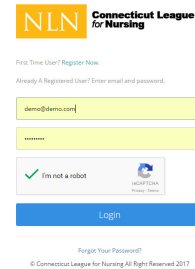
