Iconography Work Shop

The Arts and Spirituality Ministry is hosting a week long icon painting class March 19 thru March 23 2018. The class will run from 8:30 AM to 4:00 PM daily. The class will be taught by Teresa Harrison, nationally recognized teacher of iconography. The cost for the class is \$400.00 which includes all supplies and lunch each day. We will be creating an icon in the traditional Byzantine style in this work shop. Each day will begin with a Eucharist Service, noon day prayer, group reflection, and teachings on the history of

Noted for his finely detailed, brilliantly colored paintings and original prints, Swanson has works displayed in some of the world's most prestigious venues, including the Smithsonian's National Museum of American History, The Art Institute of Chicago, London's Tate Gallery, the Vatican Museums' Collection of Modern Religious Art, and the Biblioteque Nationale in Paris, among others. Candler's holdings – currently 55 pieces – comprise the largest single collection of Swanson's art in the world." A Willingness to Serve

Somewhere along my spiritual journey I was told that God is more interested in our faithfulness than our success. I was told that we are called to be faithful, not successful. I found that liberating at the time and still do. Those who grew up in environments where achievement and success mattered greatly, and failure was associated with embarrassment and shame, may also find this liberating. For God, it is not whether you succeed or fail in your calling or ministry, and it is not results or awards that count, but it is whether you answer the call. The Bible gives us a multitude of examples of this including just these few.

Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send? And who will go for us?" And I said, "Here am I. Send me!"

- Isaiah 6:8

"I am the Lord's servant," Mary answered. "May your word to me be fulfilled." Then the angel left her.

- Luke 1:38

"Father, if you are willing, take this cup from me; yet not my will, but yours be done."

- Luke 22:42

It is our faithfulness, our "yes" to a call to serve that matters to God. There are a number of reasons why that "yes" may lead to what we see as a successful ministry or outcome, but there are probably just as many reasons for why we do not see successes. And the truth may be that most of either outcome is beyond our individual control. We do pray after all, "your Kingdom come, your will be done" as we admit that God's will and Kingdom are "mysterium tremendum et fascinans" (a terrible mystery).

Your vestry nominating committee has been busy talking with folks about their willingness to serve on the Good Shepherd vestry. I understand that there are many legitimate reasons why someone would not be able to serve at this time, but for others I want them to know that their "yes" it is not about success or failure to be elected but about their faithfulness in answering the call to serve. From Fr. George

By the time you receive this newsletter, the first Mission Trip of a team of Good Shepherd parishioners will be completing their preparations and departing for Annunciation Episcopal Church in New Orleans. The plan is to repair some buildings and homes, work in soup kitchens and shelters, and do some landscaping. Repair. Work. Do. They are all verbs – action words. They are an integral part of a mission trip.

What is of equal significance – perhaps even more so – is being. Being together. In our time of being together, perhaps we perceive one another in a transformed manner. Here is a concrete example: it is literally two parishioners who are polar opposites in beliefs over a broad spectrum of issues who find that they have Christ in common. I had no idea that you ... (fill in the blank here), says one to another. In that human transaction, a divine transaction takes place. There is a substantial bond forged through repairing, working, and doing together; there is an even deeper bond forged in being together. Something happens. There is no calculable report I can make on the results of this phenomenon. I just know it's real.

By being in a relationship with the staff and parishioners of Annunciation Episcopal Church since 2007, and being a part of diverse mission teams from what will now be three different Episcopal Churches has brought me to the conclusion that our ministry is one of relationships. Our ministry is not so much about principles as much as it is about people. Furthermore, it is not always a ministry with those who agree with us. It is a ministry that pulls us out of where we feel comfortable and onto a journey that leads us into places of challenge where transformation transpires.

A therapist once told me, Lives are not going to change until that person's behavior begins to change. This was his counsel to my query as to pastorally responding in a healthy manner to people who are in a

constant state of chaos. They make poor choices that come back to them in a negative way and then blame everyone else for their sad circumstances. And, yes, there are always people who have bad things happen to them that are not their fault. I am referring here to people who are always in chaos and always pointing the finger of blame at others.

Spiritual chaos is just the same. When things do not go our way at church, then the easiest thing to do is to blame others. However, here is how that unhealthy phenomenon can be converted: When we begin to simply be with those others with whom we do not always agree in a variety of contexts from local outreach to national Mission Trips, to coffee hour in the Parish Hall to worship in the Nave, to visits in both hospital and home, we begin to see that the Kingdom of Heaven is much broader than we once imagined.

In addition to this, Jesus so often taught with the phrase that began, The Kingdom of Heaven is like ... His listeners' responses ran the gamut from surprised to shocked as to what he was teaching; he used common illustrations and turned them completely upside-down and inside-out. His past and present listeners certainly did not think that God could be in those kinds of people or even these kinds of people; or those kinds of places or even these kinds of places.

The Kingdom of Heaven might even leads us to the Kingdom of Heaven on this earth. Look carefully and listen attentively - there may even be a barn where a homeless mother and father sought shelter and are just about to become parents.

Vestry Nominations

The nominating committee consisting of Harry Baughn, Beth Hitchcock, Kanute Rarey, Karen Sirmans, Jerry Taylor and Betsi Wilson is now soliciting input for the elections of vestry members for 2017. Four new vestry members will be elected. To be eligible to run for vestry a candidate must meet the following requirements:

- **Members** – All persons whose Baptism, Confirmation, Reception or Letter of Transfer has been recorded in this church, and who have been confirmed or received by the Bishop. (Canon 1.17.1 of the Constitution and Canons of the Episcopal Church of the United States.)
- **Communicants in Good Standing of Good Shepherd** – All members of this Church who for the previous year have been faithful in corporate worship and have received Holy Communion in this Church at least three times, unless for good cause prevented, and have been faithful in working, praying, and giving

for the spread of the Kingdom of God. (Canon 1.17.3 of the Constitution and Canons of the Episcopal Church of the United States and Canon 10.7 of the Constitution and Canons of the Diocese of Western NC.)

- No less than 18 years of age, who have agreed to serve on the vestry for the elected term (3 years), to serve on one committee, and to attend Church functions.
- Have no spouse serving concurrently on the vestry.
- Shall be a contributor of record through faithful monetary giving to Good Shepherd.

If you would like to nominate a member of the parish for vestry, please contact one of the members of the nominating committee before December 25.

Absentee Voting Procedures for Vestry Election

The procedure for absentee voting is:

1. Absentee ballots may be requested from the Parish office during normal business hours, in person, by phone, by mail or by email. When an absentee ballot is requested, the Parish office issuing the ballot will mark the requester's name from the master list of Parish members eligible to vote, and such person will not be permitted to vote in person without first surrendering the absentee ballot in blank.
2. Absentee ballots must be physically received in the Parish office no later than Friday noon preceding the last Sunday of regular voting.
3. An absentee ballot will be sealed in a plain envelope without the voter's name appearing. The envelope containing the ballot will be placed in a second envelope that does include the voter's name so that it may be checked as received.
4. All absentee ballots will be opened as soon as the ballot boxes are closed, and their count will be supervised in the same manner as regular ballots.
5. The vestry election will take place on January 7 and 14 after both services. Absentee ballots may be requested now but will not be mailed before December 30. Absentee ballots must arrive back in the church office by noon on January 12.
