South Highland Presbyterian Church, PC(USA), a diverse community of reformed Christian believers in the heart of Birmingham's Southside/Five Points area, is excited to announce two Youth Advisor positions are available for college-age students residing in the Birmingham, Ala., area during the 2018-19 academic year!

We are looking for two students, attending local colleges or universities, to work with the middle and high school youth of our church on a regular basis for the upcoming year.

Terms of this position include:

- Being supervised by the Director of Youth Ministry;
- Being available to work weekly from September 2018 to May 2019, with occasional needs over the 2019 summer months;
- Receiving a \$1,500 stipend per semester, payable biweekly;
- Offering oneself to work an average of 10 hours per week; and
- Having flexible hours during the week, but especially on Sunday afternoons/evenings.

Responsibilities include (but are not limited to):

- Having a heart to fellowship with Christian teens, creating a sense of safe community for them, and teaching them about the love and message of Jesus Christ;
- Modeling a Christian way of life through thought, word, and action;
- Committing to Sunday evening Youth Group each week (currently 5-7 PM);
- Committing to preparation work in the days leading up to Youth Group as well as follow-up work in the days after Youth Group;
- Having flexibility to participate in overnight/weekend activities during the school year (Lock-ins, SHPC Winter Retreat over MLK weekend, Presbytery retreats at Living River Camp on the Cahaba, etc.) as well as week-long retreats over the summer (The Great Escape – Lee, Montreat Youth Conference – Week III);
- Regular check-ins with the Director of Youth Ministry and occasional reports to the Discipleship Formation Ministry Team, the SHPC Youth Council, and the SHPC Parent Council;
- Participation in the life of the youth on Sunday mornings;
- Sharing gifts and creativity in ministry that may include talents for music, prayer, speaking, planning, organizing, decorating, etc.; and
- Building a sense of relationship and Christian community that positively benefits all involved in the ministry, including the teens themselves, their parents, church staff, and the congregation.
