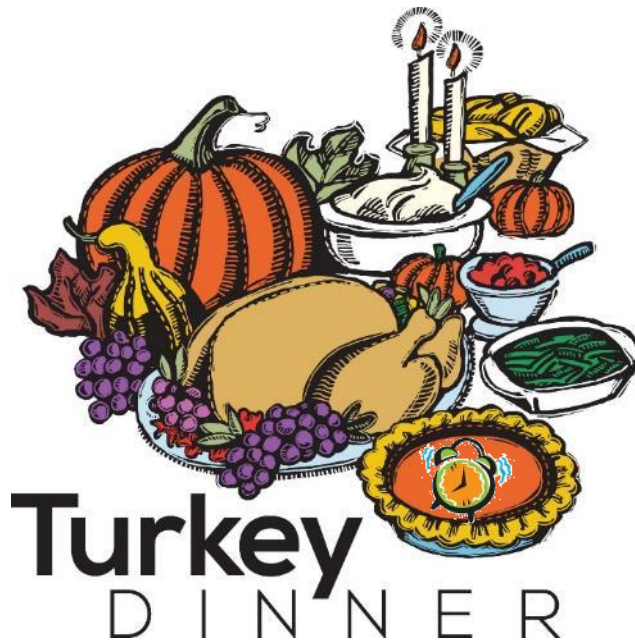

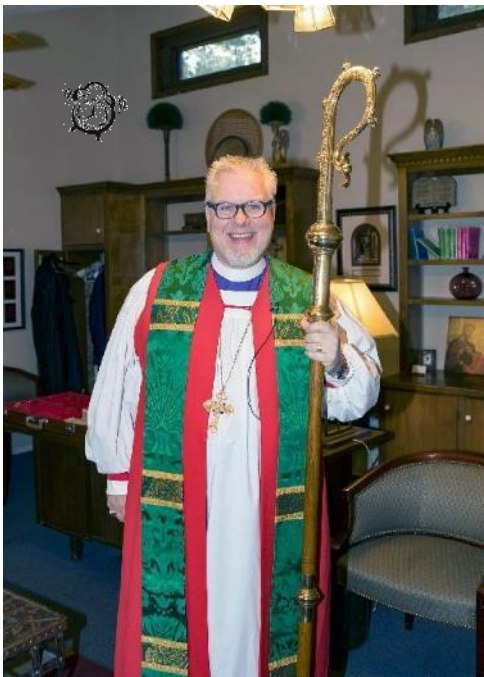

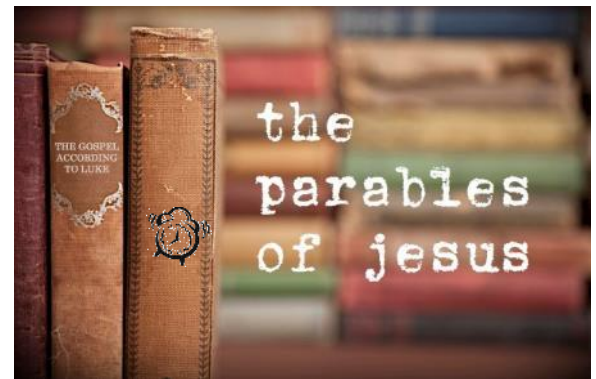
Adult Sunday School Class Series:

Tuesday, October 4, 2016: A Great Day at St. Michael's

I spent much of this Tuesday morning writing out trombone music for Ian McCarty to play when Bishop Doyle would be at St. Michael's. While I was working in the main church office, Laura Buckner, Cyndie Woodbury and Liz Garrison (Bishop's Warden at St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Kilgore) were in the Priest's office in an online conference with The Rev. Francene Young from the Diocese of Texas, talking about the future of St. Michael's and St. Paul's priests, ministries and other things.

After that meeting, Laura, Cyndie and I talked about current opportunities at St. Michael's and in East Texas. We were Sharing God's Love and making plans about how to better Share God's Love through St. Michael's.

A little after noon, in the kitchen at St. Michael's, Bruce Williams began preparing the meal that we were going to serve to about 30-40 children that night. They are from "Jesus Loves the Little Children" ministry and come to St. Michael's on the first Tuesday of each month to be fed, physically and spiritually. Bruce had marinated chicken legs and quarters that had been donated to the church. He also had a big bag of carrots and another, bigger bag of potatoes. Although by himself in the kitchen, Bruce was already beginning to Share God's Love. Margie Litterski had dropped by earlier with decorated pumpkin cookies that she and Pete had made for the children to have as dessert. They were Sharing God's Love while at home, in their own kitchen.

I then put together a projection of seven songs that we would use in worship with the children that night after they ate their meal. I went into the sanctuary to make sure the projection and the sound system were working correctly. I was Sharing God's Love, by myself, in the sanctuary, for just a few minutes. But, it was just practice for Sharing God's Love with a great group of kids, who desperately need to know God's Love.

Later that afternoon, Gayle Raif showed up to help Bruce in the kitchen. She crushed the tortilla chips with which Bruce would coat that marinated chicken. Bruce was cooking the potatoes and carrots. Susan Kuhlman then arrived and began putting together the serving line. Barbara McClellan and

Linda Gast began wrapping plastic forks and knives in napkins.

As the children began to arrive, brought by vans and private vehicles, all a part of their ministry, we began putting ice in cups and preparing to serve. As we began serving the kids (ranging in age from 5 to 15) at about 6:15pm, Cyndie



Woodbury was in the priest's office gathering six to seven people for our regular Tuesday night Bible study. After the meal, we led the kids into the sanctuary, noisily past the priest's office. And there, we sang and worshiped. Mona Clower had brought her son Michael, in the previous week to practice the songs we were

going to use with the kids that night. Michael plays bass and guitar. From the kitchen, to the priest's office, to the sanctuary, people were being fed all over St. Michael's.

While we were singing in the sanctuary, and they were Bible studying in the office, Laura Buckner, Liz Garrison, Yoni Adonyi, Susan Schug, Gayle Raif, Andrew Duncalfe, Christina Richardson and Paige Lindsey were all meeting in the Adult Sunday School classroom with Jason Evans, who had driven up from the Diocesan office in Houston, to talk about the new Piney Woods Canterbury college ministry. This is a cooperative ministry between St. Paul's in Kilgore and St. Michael's in Longview reaching out to students at LeTourneau University and Kilgore College.

As I was driving off after the college meeting concluded, there were about 25 or more cars at Joshua House where ladies from Mary Kay were meeting.

Tuesday, October 4, 2016 at St. Michael's: a long, busy, active, non-stop day at St. Michael's. And surely throughout the day we were, without fail or pause, Sharing God's Love.

Pumpkin Cookies

4 C. flour
 2 C. quick or old fashion oats
 2 t. baking soda
 2 t. ground cinnamon
 1 t. salt
 1 ½ C butter soften
 2 C packed brown sugar
 1 C granulated sugar
 1 egg
 1 t. vanilla extract
 1 can 16 oz. of libby's pumpkin
 1 C. semi sweet Choc chips
 Assorted icings, candy corn and M and M's to decorate.

Preheat oven to 350 degrees . Combine flour, oats, baking soda, cinn, and salt in a bowl and set aside. Cream butter, gradually add sugars beating until light and fluffy, add egg and vanilla, mix well. Alternate adding dry ingredients and pumpkin, stir in choc chips. Slight grease cookie sheet, drop each cookie drop ¼ C onto sheet. (try to make a shape of a circle) Bake 18- 20 min. until cookie is firm. Cool decorate with icing of choice, candy corn as eyes and nose, M & M's as a mouth. Yield about 40 cookies.

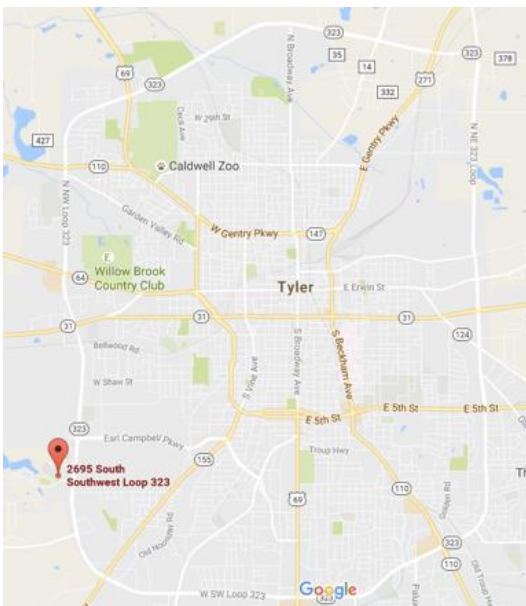
Sung Compline Service Sunday, November 13, 8:30pm Trinity Episcopal Church, Downtown Longview
