SAFETY ALERT: It was reported to Eckstein that two students, walking together, were followed by a stranger when walking on 17th Ave NE. The students stayed together and reported this immediately to a parent who followed up with SPD. Please talk to your students about safety in the community. We have reminded all students to be safe and to follow the following safety precautions:

- Stay with a group. Always walk with at least one friend, two or three is even better.
- Stick to the route discussed with your parents (Safe Walking Plan). Never use shortcuts through empty parks, alleys, fields, etc. Avoid empty buildings and isolated areas.
- Don't wear headphones. Always be aware of your surroundings.
- If a stranger offers you a ride, say “NO!” and stay far away from their car.
- If someone is following you on foot or in a car, go to a place where there are other people – to a neighbor's home or into a store, for instance – and ask for help and call 9-1-1.
- Noise is the best defense – yell, scream, shout, scatter books and belongings if forced into a car.
- Move away from any car that pulls up to the bus stop.
- Tell a trusted adult if a stranger is hanging around the school
- Never accept things from a stranger.
- If a stranger asks you a question, don't talk to them. Run away.
- Another helpful suggestion is to share a code word with your child known only among family members. It is important to stress anyone offering a ride unexpectedly – even a family friend – will have been given the code word in advance.

Schools, and state and local agencies use survey results to support our youth and reduce their risks. The Healthy Youth Survey is voluntary and anonymous and provides important information to guide policy and programs that serve our youth. The Healthy Youth Survey is given to students in grades 6, 8, 10 and 12 across Washington State. PE Waiver Forms that are due by 12/1/2018: At Eckstein, 7-8 graders who checked off "I intend to get a PE Waiver" on their subject selection sheet must complete the PE Waiver and turn it into the Main Office no later than December 1, 2018. Any 7th and 8th grader who is not assigned PE sometime during the school year and have not completed a Waiver by 12/1/18 **will be pulled from an elective and assigned PE in the 2nd semester.** [Eckstein PE Waiver 2018-19](#). Students in grade 1-8 are required to participate in an average of at least 100 instructional minutes per school week in PE classes (60) hours per .5 semester credit), unless such participation is waived. Be sure and complete the "Total Documents Hours" toward the bottom of the page.
