Online Student Verification Form: Parents/Guardians – The online Student Verification form is now available for you to review and make changes. To fill out your student's data verification form, please do the following: Log into the Source by going to <https://ps.seattleschools.org/public/> and click on "Data Verification form." If you have multiple students at the district, you will fill out a data verification form for each student. You will be able to make changes through January 5th. The district has indicated that this process replaced the paper data verification forms that used to be sent home at the beginning of each school year. The system is a secure and green process, which allows the district to verify all student demographic, emergency and medical information for your child(ren).
