Eckstein will be starting school at 8:55 and will end at 3:45 on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday. Currently the district has a variety of early release days during the school year to support staff professional development. Next year in support of educator collaboration and instructional planning, we will have a consistent weekly schedule. Students will be released 75 minutes early every Wednesday (except for the first day of school).

Incoming 6th Grade WEB Day: Mon, Aug 28, 8 am – 12 pm. We are excited to welcome all incoming 6th grade students to Eckstein WEB Day on Monday, August 28th from 8am to noon in the school gym. WEB stands for “Where Everybody Belongs,” and this special day is designed to provide the opportunity for students to become familiar with Eckstein, meet their 8th grade student leaders and learn tips for achieving success in middle school.
