Flu Season is Still in Full Swing: It is not too late to get the Flu Vaccine. Flu vaccine (shots and nasal spray) is available at many healthcare provider offices and pharmacies. You can use <http://flushot.healthmap.org> to help locate it near you. Flu vaccination is the single best way to protect yourself and your loved ones from flu. Health experts recommend flu vaccine for all people 6 months and older, and especially for pregnant women and high-risk persons. Make sure everyone who lives with or cares for a baby younger than 6 months gets vaccinated to protect the baby from getting flu.

You can also take these everyday steps to protect against the flu:

- Wash your hands often with soap and water, or use alcohol-based hand cleaners.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, or mouth. Touching these areas spreads germs.

- Avoid close contact with sick people.
- Get plenty of rest.

Help stop the spread of flu, especially to people in high-risk groups:

- Cover your nose and mouth with your sleeve or a tissue when you cough or sneeze.
- Stay home from work and school if you are sick until at least 24 hours after your fever is gone and avoid close contact with others.

Message from the School Nurse: As you may know, many cases of mumps are showing up in King County.

Please watch your students closely for signs and symptoms, including: fever, headache, muscle aches, tiredness, loss of appetite, and/or swollen, tender salivary glands under the jaw or in the lower cheeks. If you notice these in your student, please contact their health care provider immediately. Fortunately, students who have been vaccinated are far less likely to get mumps, and if they do, are less likely to have a severe case. Please ensure that your student has been thoroughly vaccinated. Be advised: there is a possibility that if a case occurs in our school community, students who have not been fully vaccinated may need to be excluded from school for at least 25 days for their own and the community's safety. Reminder to all visitors to Eckstein Middle School: Please remember that all visitors, volunteers, parents, former students, guests, etc., need to immediately report to the Main Office, sign in, state your business and wear a visitor or volunteer badge each time you visit Eckstein Middle School. This is for the safety and security of our students, staff and visitors according to District and state regulations. Even if you are picking up or meeting your students afterschool, please wait outside or by the Main Office until school is dismissed. We have had several people wandering the school and in order for our security person to make sure we know who you are, we need you to adhere to these requests. Thank you.

Parents & Guardians: Please help us keep students safe by DRIVING SLOWLY AND CAREFULLY around the school. It is NOT SAFE to let your student get out of the car in the “No Stopping” zone on 30th Ave NE or across the street from the school on NE 75th St. There have been some dangerous near-misses in the mornings caused by inattentive drivers or by students dashing across the street mid-block. We urge you to remind your student to always use the crosswalk, not to text while walking and to make eye contact with the driver before crossing in front of a stopped car. We know everyone is scrambling to get to school and work on time in the mornings, but it is not worth risking an accident to gain a few extra minutes!

****Summer Activity Scholarship Opportunity!** The Assistance League of Seattle's Enrichment Scholarship Program provides financial resources to students enrolled in grades 6-11 in Seattle Public Schools so that they can participate in the summer enrichment learning experience of their choice. Students apply for up to \$500 in funding to camps for music, art, mathematics, language, leadership, journalism, culinary, computer science, and more.

- Eligibility Requirements:
 - Must be a student in Seattle Public Schools (home school students with SPS affiliation are also eligible).
 - Must be enrolled in grades 6 to 11.
 - Must complete and submit an application form by the application cut-off date.
 - NB: We do not fund sports or religious enrichment programs.
- Applicants:
 - Download and complete the [Enrichment Scholarship Program Application Form](#).
 - Applications are accepted starting in January.
 - Applications are reviewed and evaluated by the program committee by mid-April.
 - Students are notified of the results of the program committee's evaluations by letter.
 - Scholarships are awarded/distributed by (approximately) the end of April.
 - Scholarship award checks are made payable directly to the student's enrichment program or class, then sent with an award letter to the student's home address.
 - It is the responsibility of the student awarded the scholarship to complete the necessary application to his or her chosen program and also to include the check issued by Assistance League of Seattle with their application as payment.
