District News

Potential Bus Service Disruption: Update Oct. 16: The District is continuing to monitor and have been told that as of today a bus drivers strike has not been called. However, sometimes in situations such as these, districts are given very little warning. We encourage families whose students ride First Student buses to monitor the district's website and check their email daily for any changes to school bus service. We will use the website, email, phone messages and social media to share information about potential bus service impacts. First Student, our contracted school bus provider, has notified the district that the bus drivers may strike. There is no imminent strike date, however, if a strike is held this would mean limited or no yellow bus service.

Student Assignment Plan and High School Boundary Open Houses: Student Assignment Plan and High School Boundary Community Meetings: Five open house meetings are scheduled for families, students and staff about changes to the Student Assignment Plan (SAP) and high school boundaries. District office staff will be available to discuss the 2018-19 SAP, including related updates to special education, school choice, and advanced learning opportunities in high schools. Visitors will also be able to review the proposed high school boundary scenarios.

****We are still missing 118 – 7th graders and 124 – 8th grader PE Waiver Forms that are due by 12/1/2017:** At Eckstein, 7-8 graders who checked off "I intend to get a PE Waiver" on their subject selection sheet must complete the PE Waiver and turn it into the Main Office no later than December 1, 2017. Any 7th and 8th grader who is not assigned PE sometime during the school year and have not completed a Waiver by 12/1/17 *will be pulled from an elective and assigned PE in the 2nd semester.* [PE WAIVER 2017-18](#). Students in grade 1-8 are required to participate in an average of at least 100 instructional minutes per school week in PE classes (60) hours per .5 semester credit), unless such participation is waived. Be sure and complete the "Total Documents Hours" toward the bottom of the page.

Students must be cleared by a physician to play, so don't wait until the last minute to get a sports physical and complete the forms! If you have a *current* physical on file, please write "Physical on File". Students are not permitted to participate in tryouts or practices until ALL forms have been submitted and cleared.

There is also a link in the Source. Yearbooks are \$25. You can also pay with cash or check at the main office. Make checks payable to Eckstein Middle School and put your student's name somewhere on the check.

The PTSA is running a SCRIP program to help benefit the PTSA and thus Eckstein. What is SCRIP? SCRIP allows you to purchase gift cards from 100s of major retailers at face value while earning money for the PTSA – anywhere from 2% to 16% of the purchase price, depending on the retailer. The PTSA has opted to always carry cards from Amazon (\$100), PCC (\$10), Safeway (\$25 and \$100), Starbucks (\$25), and Target (\$50 and \$100). You can also special order cards from 100s of other retailers. Orders will be filled twice a month (perhaps more often as the holidays approach) and cards will be delivered to the front office for pickup. You will be notified by email when your order is ready. Got cool crafting/robotics/programming supplies around you'd like to donate to the library? Student have been using the Eckstein Library MakerSpace at lunch and after school. The MakerSpace currently includes materials such as a green screen and iPad, LittleBits electronics kit, 2 Sphero robots, Makey Makey kits, whiteboard tables, and some fun engineering materials. I will be training some students how to use a Cricut printer and a stop motion animation camera soon! The goal behind the Eckstein MakerSpace is to encourage students to work together and become designers and creators. This week, you might start to receive Eckstein Library overdue notices via email. (You will only receive an email if your student has a book lost or overdue). They are automatically sent out once a week. Note: there are no fees for overdue books. The only fees are for lost books. If your student actually has the lost book at home, have them turn it in for no fee. Occasionally, students are due refunds, which usually appear in emails in parentheses. If

another school is listed, that means the book is lost from another school they attended and you will need to contact the librarian at that school to take care of it. Good news this year! News from the Nurse ~ Tips on Preventing and treating the Flu: The flu season is upon us and the best way to protect your family is with the annual flu vaccine. It is recommended everyone 6 months of age and older get the seasonal flu vaccine (shot or nasal spray) every year. The flu can spread very quickly in schools, and young children and children with medical conditions such as asthma and diabetes can have serious problems if they get the flu. Take the time to talk to your children about washing their hands often, coughing into their sleeve or tissue, not sharing their personal items (such as chap stick, drinks and food) and keeping their hands out of their mouths, nose and eyes. In addition, please remember: if your child is sick and comes down with a fever, do not send her/him to school. Keep your sick child home for at least 24 hours after the fever goes away. Your child can come back to school after her/his temperature returns to normal for 24 hours without medication. It is very easy to get the Flu vaccine. Most pharmacies offer it. You can check with your insurance provider to see if it is free.
