LETTER FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Families,

We are just starting second semester. Please review your student's progress together and please, let us know if we can help. Your teachers, counselors and administrative staff are always available to assist.

As we launch second semester, our staff is working hard to be reflective in analyzing first semester data, identifying areas of growth and areas of celebrations. We have much to celebrate.

This year, we have really worked to implement culturally responsive strategies that improve learning for all students through increasing student voice and supporting executive skills development. We are seeing incredible indicators that our work is helping to create a cohesive, supportive and engaging environment. In the next few days, students will take a homework survey and a mid-year climate survey. We will use this information to guide our work. We know that our students are more supported academically and outcomes are higher looking at performance data, but we also want to ensure that they are feeling supported and having positive interactions in our community. I look forward to sharing these results with you as we all work together to create a learning community that supports all students, their academic growth and their social and emotional development.

February is Black History Month. Our goal is to make sure that each and every month incorporates Black history and cultural relevance for all of our students into our work, classrooms and curriculum. We also honor Black History Month to highlight and celebrate the specific historical accomplishments of African and African American peoples, whose history has traditionally been underrepresented in many contexts. Next week, I will share the work we are doing as a community and in the classrooms toward this end, as well as a list of local events that you may want to explore as a family.

Finally, I am so proud of all the students who attended last Saturday's Homework Help Session! Staff supported students in getting work done in a positive atmosphere! I am thankful to the teachers who volunteered and all of the students who came. One student said, "I have NEVER done so much work at one time in my whole life. I want to come every Saturday!" (Disclaimer – Results may vary!) The next Saturday session is scheduled for March 3rd.

High School Boundary Changes: In 2019-20, new high school boundaries will be implemented with the opening of Lincoln High School in North Seattle. Ingraham High School also will have a significant capacity increase due to a building expansion. At the Jan. 17, School Board meeting, the School Board discussed the 2019-20 High School Growth Boundaries Plan and reviewed the Fv4.3 draft boundary map. Additionally, Directors Mack and Burke introduced an amendment on high school boundary changes and highly capable pathways. The board is scheduled to take action on the new high school boundaries and any changes to the high school highly capable pathways at the Jan. 31 school board meeting.

Source Accounts: Source accounts parents and guardians set up prior to August 2017 of this year with a username that does NOT match the email address on PowerSchool > Demographics > Student Contact will be DISABLED Saturday, February 3, 2018.

Some parents may still be using these old Source accounts. When you log in, and see an alert, but have not taken action, you will NOT have access to Data Verification Forms or SchoolPay. In this case you will need to provide Eckstein (Sue Wong stwong@seattleschools.org, Ann Peterson apeterson@seattleschools.org or Julia Detering irdetering@seattleschools.org) the **same email address for each SPS student in their family** to ensure continued Source access. If the school updates parent/guardian email addresses, the change will take 2 hours to sync with the Source. After waiting 2 hours, the parent/guardian will need to clear the cache on their browser, close their browser, reopen and [set up](#) their Source account with the new email address.

If parents/guardians use a smart phone to view the Source, remember to use a supported browser such as **Chrome** or **Firefox** and the Source URL: <http://ps.seattleschools.org> Do NOT to install the PowerSchool APP as it does not support SPS customizations.

Update: Student Assignment Transition Plan and High School Boundaries: The Seattle School Board voted **not** to adopt the 2018-19 Student Assignment Transition Plan (SATP) at the Dec. 6, 2017 board meeting. The 2018-19 SATP included recommendations on new high school highly capable pathways for 2019-20.
