## **LETTER FROM THE PRINCIPAL**

Eckstein Families,

## **District News**

**\*\*Potential Bus Service Disruption: Update Oct. 16:** The District is continuing to monitor and have been told that as of today a bus drivers strike has not been called. However, sometimes in situations such as these, districts are given very little warning. We encourage families whose students ride First Student buses to monitor the district's website and check their email daily for any changes to school bus service. We will use the website, email, phone messages and social media to share information about potential bus service impacts. First Student, our contracted school bus provider, has notified the district that the bus drivers may strike. There is no imminent strike date, however, if a strike is held this would mean limited or no yellow bus service.

**\*\*Student Assignment Plan and High School Boundary Open Houses:** Student Assignment Plan and High School Boundary Community Meetings: Five open house meetings are scheduled for families, students and staff about changes to the Student Assignment Plan (SAP) and high school boundaries. District office staff will be available to discuss the 2018-19 SAP, including related updates to special education, school choice, and advanced learning opportunities in high schools. Visitors will also be able to review the proposed high school boundary scenarios.

**FLU SHOTS for Our students and Community!** Please join us and help keep our schools, families and communities healthy and flu free this season! According to the CDC (Centers for Disease Control and Prevention), the single best way to protect you and your family from influenza is to receive a “flu shot” each year. The CDC recommends that EVERYONE, over six months of age, should be vaccinated against the flu.

The Clinics are open to all School District faculty, staff, students, and their families (children four years of age and older). Please note that students under the age of 18 will need a Patient Consent Form signed by a parent or guardian. Patient Consent Forms will be available at the clinic. All participants will be asked to provide their health insurance information (card) to receive an immunization. SVNA will electronically bill the insurance plan for your flu shot. They bill almost all insurance plans, but are not able to accept Cigna. Flu shots are considered preventive care and normally are not subject to deductibles or co-pays. Students 18 years and under without current health insurance coverage will be offered a flu shot at no cost. Adults without current insurance coverage may pay the \$30.00 immunization fee for standard Trivalent with cash or check.

**News from the Nurse ~ Tips on Preventing and treating the Flu:** The flu season is upon us and the best way to protect your family is with the annual flu vaccine. It is recommended everyone 6 months of age and older get the seasonal flu vaccine (shot or nasal spray) every year. The flu can spread very quickly in schools, and young children and children with medical conditions such as asthma and diabetes can have serious problems if they get the flu. Take the time to talk to your children about washing their hands often, coughing into their sleeve or tissue, not sharing their personal items (such as chap stick, drinks and food) and keeping their hands out of their mouths, nose and eyes. In addition, please remember: if your child is sick and comes down with a fever, do not send her/him to school. Keep your sick child home for at least 24 hours after the fever goes away. Your child can come back to school after her/his temperature returns to normal for 24 hours without medication. It is very easy to get the Flu vaccine. Most pharmacies offer it. You can check with your insurance provider to see if it is free.
