**Potential Bus Service Disruption: Update Oct. 16:** The District is continuing to monitor and have been told that as of today a bus drivers strike has not been called. However, sometimes in situations such as these, districts are given very little warning. We encourage families whose students ride First Student buses to monitor the district's website and check their email daily for any changes to school bus service. We will use the website, email, phone messages and social media to share information about potential bus service impacts. First Student, our contracted school bus provider, has notified the district that the bus drivers may strike. There is no imminent strike date, however, if a strike is held this would mean limited or no yellow bus service.

**\*\*Your Input Needed on High School Boundary Changes:** You may be aware that with Lincoln High School opening in 2019, school boundary lines are being redrawn now. We encourage you to please view and comment on the proposed high school boundary changes, as they will determine where Eckstein students will attend high school. The high school boundaries task force recently came up with a preferred option ([Scenario H v2](#)). This scenario splits Eckstein students after middle school, assigning some to Nathan Hale, others to Roosevelt. In contrast, the version they were considering just prior to this ([Scenario H](#)) aligns high school boundaries to existing elementary and middle school boundaries, so that all Eckstein students would stay together and move as a cohort to Roosevelt.

Although Scenario H v2 is the current preferred option, the task force is actively soliciting feedback through the end of November, before they make a final decision about which scenario to present to the school board in December. Seattle Public Schools is also doing a community survey of people's thoughts about high school boundaries. **\*\*Eckstein Orchestra Fundraiser is in Full Swing!** In order to raise funds to support our orchestra program, we have traditionally held a holiday wreath fundraiser. **\*\*Updated ~ We are still missing 94 – 7<sup>th</sup> graders and 103 – 8<sup>th</sup> grader PE Waiver Forms that are due by 12/1/2017:** At Eckstein, 7-8 graders who checked off "I intend to get a PE Waiver" on their subject selection sheet must complete the PE Waiver and turn it into the Main Office no later than December 1, 2017. Any 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grader who is not assigned PE sometime during the school year and have not completed a Waiver by 12/1/17 **will be pulled from an elective and assigned PE in the 2<sup>nd</sup> semester.** [PE WAIVER 2017-18](#). Students in grade 1-8 are required to participate in an average of at least 100 instructional minutes per school week in PE classes (60 hours per .5 semester credit), unless such participation is waived. **News from the Nurse ~ Tips on Preventing and treating the Flu:** The flu season is upon us and the best way to protect your family is with the annual flu vaccine. It is recommended everyone 6 months of age and older get the seasonal flu vaccine (shot or nasal spray) every year. The flu can spread very quickly in schools, and young children and children with medical conditions such as asthma and diabetes can have serious problems if they get the flu. Take the time to talk to your children about washing their hands often, coughing into their sleeve or tissue, not

sharing their personal items (such as chap stick, drinks and food) and keeping their hands out of their mouths, nose and eyes. In addition, please remember: if your child is sick and comes down with a fever, do not send her/him to school. Keep your sick child home for at least 24 hours after the fever goes away. Your child can come back to school after her/his temperature returns to normal for 24 hours without medication. It is very easy to get the Flu vaccine. Most pharmacies offer it. You can check with your insurance provider to see if it is free. - If you don't have a valid email in the system you will be guided to create a guest account. You will need your student's ID number and school name to continue. Guest accounts will not have visibility to balances due to privacy requirements but can make payments on a student's behalf. Only the validated parent will have access to all student information
- Once logged in to SchoolPay, click "Payments" to see fee based items for the students associated with your SchoolPay account in one schools participating in Phase 1. If two or more students are associated with your SchoolPay account, click on the drop-down arrow next to "all items by name" to view items by student.
