COURSE DESCRIPTIONS FOR SEVENTH GRADE ELECTIVES 2017-2018
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7th graders have the opportunity to take year-long and/or semester long elective classes. Scheduling depends upon the numbers of students and availability of staff. Factors sometimes change during the summer; the final classes may not be exactly as presented.

World Languages – You can begin the exploration of new cultures and countries through one of three languages: Spanish, French or Japanese. Beginning in 7th grade you will have two years to gain a novice to mid-level of fluency with a language and get one High School credit for World Language. Classes include fun-filled learning of the culture of these languages and how to use them.

Visual Art –

- Visual Arts (semester 1) Fall. This course will focus on 3-dimensional projects in both traditional and nontraditional mediums such as found in object sculpture, paper mache, and clay.
- Visual Arts (semester 2) Spring. The class will focus on drawing and painting taught classically. Students will experiment with more advanced materials such as charcoal, acrylic paint and pastel, while gaining a more in-depth knowledge of technique.
- Advanced Visual Arts (full year): Students will create 2- and 3-dimensional pieces that further develop the elements of art and principles of design. Students in this course will obtain foundation knowledge of a series of different artistic mediums. Students will be asked to complete a number of projects that follow detailed steps, familiarizing them with techniques that will be used in higher level art classes.

Semester Computer Science & Technology –

- Web Design (Semester 1): This course is an introduction to website and graphic design. Students will learn basic photoshop skills to build original content. Coursework will include planning effective web pages; building site structure using HTML and CSS code; enhancing content with formatting, graphics, images, and multimedia.
- CS Discoveries (Semester 2): Students will see how a thorough user-centered design process produces a better application, how their personal data is collected and used on the web, and they will work with circuit boards to see how computers collect input and return output in a variety of ways. Student groups will iterate on and refine a mobile app that integrates concepts they have learned throughout the course.

Semester Guitar - Students will learn on traditional nylon string classical guitars. The class is structured so that students of different levels can progress at their own pace. Every student will be expected to demonstrate their improvement in class recitals. Emphasis will be placed on note and rhythm reading with a graded series of songs. Students will not play by ear in this class.

Semester Leadership – Leadership is a one semester class open to responsible, service minded 7th and 8th grade students wishing to make a difference at Eckstein Middle School. Students will learn about important characteristics of leaders and how to develop those same characteristics in themselves. Students will be responsible for designing and executing projects and activities that benefit the student body at Eckstein. Examples of these activities could be lunchtime basketball tournaments, Spirit Weeks, assemblies, dances and other student activities. Many of these endeavors require a strong work ethic, the ability to work successfully as a group, and public speaking techniques. Students who are interested in developing their character and bringing new ideas to Eckstein are invited to join Leadership.

Semester P.E. – Eckstein students enjoy an exciting and challenging PE program, where the activities range from personal conditioning to individual and team sports like soccer, rock climbing, rowing, and volleyball. The activities are constantly changing and there is something for everyone. CPR is also taught. Proper PE clothing (PE shirt and athletic shoes and pants/shorts) is required.
