**Flu Season is Still in Full Swing:** It is not too late to get the Flu Vaccine. Flu vaccine (shots and nasal spray) is available at many healthcare provider offices and pharmacies. You can use <http://flushot.healthmap.org> to help locate it near you. Flu vaccination is the single best way to protect yourself and your loved ones from flu. Health experts recommend flu vaccine for all people 6 months and older, and especially for pregnant women and high-risk persons. Make sure everyone who lives with or cares for a baby younger than 6 months gets vaccinated to protect the baby from getting flu.

You can also take these everyday steps to protect against the flu:

- Wash your hands often with soap and water, or use alcohol-based hand cleaners.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, or mouth. Touching these areas spreads germs.
- Avoid close contact with sick people.
- Get plenty of rest.

Help stop the spread of flu, especially to people in high-risk groups:

- Cover your nose and mouth with your sleeve or a tissue when you cough or sneeze.
- Stay home from work and school if you are sick until at least 24 hours after your fever is gone and avoid close contact with others.

**Message from the School Nurse:** As you may know, many cases of mumps are showing up in King County. Please watch your students closely for signs and symptoms, including: fever, headache, muscle aches, tiredness, loss of appetite, and/or swollen, tender salivary glands under the jaw or in the lower cheeks. If you notice these in your student, please contact their health care provider immediately. Fortunately, students who have been vaccinated

are far less likely to get mumps, and if they do, are less likely to have a severe case. Please ensure that your student has been thoroughly vaccinated. Be advised: there is a possibility that if a case occurs in our school community, students who have not been fully vaccinated may need to be excluded from school for at least 25 days for their own and the community's safety. **Parents & Guardians:** Please help us keep students safe by DRIVING SLOWLY AND CAREFULLY around the school. We urge you to remind your student to always use the crosswalk, not to text while walking and to make eye contact with the driver before crossing in front of a stopped car. We know everyone is scrambling to get to school and work on time in the mornings, but it is not worth risking an accident to gain a few extra minutes!
