LETTER FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Families,

We have had a great first FULL week of school at Eckstein. Students are into their daily routine, are opening their lockers with ease, and hard at work in our classrooms.

****Volunteers needed for 8th Grade Language Arts Project:** We need volunteers to bake clay gingerbread boy and girl detectives for 8th grade Language Arts. We need 375 clay detectives by October 15, 2018. Most volunteers make about 24, but you can make more!

You will need: Gingerbread boy and girl cookie cutters, flour, salt, water, an oven.

Recipe

Preheat oven to 225

2 cups flour

2 cups salt

1 cup water

Mix salt and flour together, add water, mix together, then knead until smooth and not sticky. Add flour a little at a time as needed. Roll out dough to about $\frac{1}{4}$ inch thickness. Cut into gingerbread shapes. There is no need to leave space between cookies, since this dough will not rise. Put them on a cookie sheet and bake at 225 degrees for 2-3 hours until hard.
