LETTER FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Happy Friday, Eckstein Families!

Spring is near, and our students all seem to be on the edge of their seats hoping to get outside. We are really looking forward to a break in the rain soon!

There are three more weeks left in the third quarter, and this can be a challenging time for students. Their school work has become more rigorous, they are putting together independent projects, and the student expectations that we taught and practiced in the fall are now being incorporated into each day. Things can be even more challenging for those students who are involved in extracurricular activities, which can be rewarding but also demanding. I encourage you to check in with your student regularly about his or her stress level during this busy time.

Remember that even students who appear to handle school and activities easily may need a reassuring word and some assistance with time management to help them deal with feelings of stress and give them a sense of control.

Our goal as a school staff is to ensure that students are engaged and challenged, but still feeling supported, and you can help with this at home, too. Use the student planner or calendar to identify homework time and free time.

When you know that there is going to be a busy week or a time-consuming outside event ahead, help your student plan or even ask for a deadline extension in advance, if necessary. If a student is struggling, please talk to a counselor and/or a teacher – we want to help.

And finally, please consider coming out to support the Eckstein girls' and boys' basketball players this Saturday. The boys play at 1 pm at Madison Middle School and the 1st-seeded girls play at 10 am at Denny Middle School, with the championship game at 4 pm if they win. Go Eagles!

Summer Activity Scholarship Opportunity! The Assistance League of Seattle's Enrichment Scholarship Program provides financial resources to students enrolled in grades 6-11 in Seattle Public Schools so that they can participate in the summer enrichment learning experience of their choice. Students apply for up to \$500 in funding to camps for music, art, mathematics, language, leadership, journalism, culinary, computer science, and more.

- Eligibility Requirements:
 - Must be a student in Seattle Public Schools (home school students with SPS affiliation are also eligible).
 - Must be enrolled in grades 6 to 11.
 - Must complete and submit an application form by the application cut-off date.
 - NB: We do not fund sports or religious enrichment programs.
- Applicants:
 - Download and complete the [Enrichment Scholarship Program Application Form](#).
 - Applications are accepted starting in January.
 - Applications are reviewed and evaluated by the program committee by mid-April.
 - Students are notified of the results of the program committee's evaluations by letter.
 - Scholarships are awarded/distributed by (approximately) the end of April.
 - Scholarship award checks are made payable directly to the student's enrichment program or class, then sent with an award letter to the student's home address.
 - It is the responsibility of the student awarded the scholarship to complete the necessary application to his or her chosen program and also to include the check issued by Assistance League of Seattle with their application as payment.
