

Dr. Danielle Adamsky accepted a part time position as a licensed psychologist within the outpatient department of Adelphoi in the spring of 2015. She provides individual psychotherapy to Adelphoi clients and has more recently begun to assist with the psychological portions of Adelphoi's diagnostic evaluation program. She expresses a significant passion for working with the clients at the Adelphoi secure facilities. Dr. Adamsky's current full time position is Director of Psychological Services for Torrance State Hospital. Providing treatment for clinically complex cases, developing intervention programs and milieus for the hospital, supervising the psychology staff on the forensic and civil side of the hospital, and operating as the Training Director for the predoctoral clinical psychology internship and practicums are among some of her responsibilities.

Dr. Adamsky obtained a Bachelor Degree in Psychology from Dickinson College. After completing a Masters program at Indiana University of Pennsylvania, she later earned her Doctorate in Clinical Psychology at IUP. Dr. Adamsky has been licensed and providing psychological services for approximately ten years. Her initial clinical focus was working with children and families, however, this quickly changed to a specialization in forensic psychology after two years of graduate school. Dr. Adamsky has worked in prisons, juvenile detention centers, forensic units of state inpatient hospitals, and private forensic practice. She has been a Clinically Certified Sex Offender Treatment Specialist for over five years and also holds clinical certifications including DBT and Motivational Interviewing.

Dr. Adamsky has been married to her husband Joe for ten years and is the mother of two children, her daughter Sydney and son Tyler. She is an active member of her church and takes particular pride in her role within the local PTA. She is a volunteer for the Alice Paul House, which is a shelter for victims of domestic violence, and is a Board Member for The CARE Center of Indiana County, which is an organization offering comprehensive forensic interviews to children who have been sexually and physically abused.
