Reaching non-Christians was the highest priority for the early church. Indeed the very "call to arms" of Christ for His Church was to reach out and make disciples.






April is all but here. If you know me well, you know that for me, one of the most exciting things about this time of the year is that the Cardinals will be playing regular season baseball very soon!

As of February 28th we have received \$264,199 in offerings out of \$545,879 planned for in the FY 16/17 Mission & Ministry Plan. We are 30 Sundays into our fiscal year averaging \$8,807 per week in offerings. Our planned average was \$10,498 per week. We were \$1,691 per week below our planned average.

Our approved planned expenses were \$1,387,066. As of February 28th we spent \$822,044.




NOTES FROM YOUR MUSIC DIRECTOR

We sold \$11,472.21 worth of gift cards during the month of January.

Total Rebate earned was \$565.79 worth of "free" money that went to these funds:



Capital Improvement Fund earned \$65.43 with 13 families participating
School Scholarship Fund earned \$18.89 with 4 families participating
School Tuition distributed \$91.22 with 10 families participating
Extended Care distributed \$13.57 with 3 families participating
Playground Fund distributed \$27.63 with 4 families participating
Youth Accounts distributed \$38.88 with 3 families participating

The Technology Fund received \$258.17 with 43 families participating. (Remember that 1/2 of the rebates automatically go to our Technology Fund, but several families have 100% of their rebates going to this fund.)


