Harvard University Implicit-association tests.

Social scientists from the Harvard University developed the implicit-association tests. The test measures your attitude towards topics like – race, gender, sexual orientation, age, weight and religion. The goal of the project is to "examine thoughts and feelings that exist either outside of conscious awareness or conscious control." The racial bias test involves the participant choosing quickly between pictures of white/black faces and good/bad words. In short: how fast do you categorize negative words when paired with African-American face in contrast to other similar sorting exercises.

To get the most benefit out of this event we recommend taking one or all of the following tests prior to the event; **Race IAT**, **Asian IAT**, and **Sexuality IAT**

When you are aware of your own bias you are able to connect with these unconscious feelings and be self-aware of your decisions.
