The Al Shaqab Lockinge Stakes

Named after a former parish located to the north of Newbury, the Al Shaqab-sponsored Lockinge Stakes was established in 1958 over the straight mile at Newbury Racecourse.

The first running was won by a three-year-old, Pall Mall, owned by Her Majesty the Queen, fresh from Classic victory in the 2,000 Guineas over at Newmarket. He went on to win the 1959 Lockinge Stakes too, becoming the first of three dual winners of the famous Newbury race. 2018 sees the race run for the 60th time.

The Al Shaqab Lockinge Stakes has been won by some of the greatest racehorses in the history of the turf. In 1972 Brigadier Gerard was an authoritative winner on his seasonal reappearance as a four-year-old. Arriving at Newbury on the back of a faultless campaign the year before which heralded four major victories, he subsequently only tasted defeat once and retired as the winner of 17 of his 18 starts, including 10 races which now hold Group One status.

Forty years later in 2012, it was the unbeaten Frankel who stole the show, winning by five lengths in effortless style at the start of what was to be a momentous four-year-old career. Unbeaten Frankel was given the highest official rating (140) of any racehorse in modern history at the end of that year, and retired with 14 straight victories - the defining equine hero for a generation of racing fans.

The Al Shaqab Lockinge Stakes has seen countless other memorable performances. Lester Piggott's six victories spanning 33 years, Hawk Wing's remarkable and record-breaking 11-length victory in 2003 and a resurgent Frankie Dettori guiding Olympic Glory to victory in 2014 are just a few.

The Newbury race was promoted to Group One status in 1995, the year the conditions were changed to make the Lockinge Europe's early-season mile highlight for older horses. It is part of the QIPCO British Champions Series.

Al Shaqab took over as sponsor of the whole card on Al Shaqab Lockinge Day in 2015, providing a significant prize money boost, and was rewarded with a record turnout of 16 runners and a revised race programme of the highest quality.

This investment on Newbury's richest raceday has produced an increase in the quality of racing on offer, with the European Pattern Committee having upgraded the opening Al Rayyan Stakes to Group Three status ahead of the 2016 renewal.

*Dual G1 winner, with top-level successes coming in the 2016 Darley July Cup over six furlongs at Newmarket and in Prix de la Foret over seven furlongs at Chantilly, France, in early October of the same year.

*Enjoyed another good campaign in 2017, finishing third in G1 Diamond Jubilee Stakes at Royal Ascot in June and runner-up in the G1 Darley July Cup. Ended the campaign with impressive three and a half-length victory in G2 Challenge Stakes over seven furlongs at Newmarket in October.

*Has yet to win over a mile. Two previous efforts at the distance came when fourth in 2016 G1 Al Shaqab Lockinge Stakes at Newbury, not having the clearest of runs, and when sixth in 2016 G1 Breeders' Cup Mile at Santa Anita, USA.

*Only other outing at Newbury came when successful in Listed Rose Bowl Stakes (6f) as a two-year-old in July, 2014.

*Unbeaten in four starts as a two-year-old, culminating in victory in the Listed and valuable totepool Two-Year-Old Trophy (6f) at Redcar.

*Harry Bentley has ridden Limato in nine of the horse's most recent 10 races.

*The name is an amalgam of Li (Paul Jacobs' wife Linda), Ma (Jacobs' mother Marjorie) and To (Jacobs' father Tom).

* Limato was purchased by bloodstock agents Peter & Ross Doyle from the draft of Weylands Stud at the 2013 Doncaster Premier Yearling Sale for £41,000 and went into training with Richard Hannon, but never ran for him.

*Limato was bred by Seamus Phelan, formerly of Weylands Stud in County Kildare, Ireland, and now Tetrarch Stud. He is the second foal out of Come April.

Paul G Jacobs

Born in Plymouth in 1946, Paul Jacobs was brought up in Kenya and had his first introduction to racing at Ngong Racecourse, where his parents worked at weekends. Jacobs became a partner in a City of London law firm, where Lesley Graham was recruited as an articled clerk. He subsequently purchased Coronation Sables in Newmarket along with Graham and her then husband Neil in 1989. His first win as an owner was Neil Graham-trained Gay Glint in a Leicester maiden on March 26, 1990. Jacobs has had horses in training ever since, on the Flat and over jumps. They are trained by Henry Candy, Simon Dow, Emma Lavelle and Harry Whittington. Neil Graham still acts as an advisor. The owner's dark green, black and white colours are inspired by his favourite football club – Plymouth Argyle.

Henry Candy

Born on October 28, 1944, Henry Candy has been a trainer for over 44 years and involved for much longer as his father Derrick trained. Following working spells as a pupil assistant in Australia (Tommy Smith) and France (Mick Bartholomew), not to mention eight years as assistant to his father, Candy took out his first trainer's licence in 1974 on his father's retirement, taking over Kingston Warren stables, to the north of Lambourn, his home as a child. He saddled 23 winners in 1974, his first runner was a winner Kambalda, who went on to win the Ascot Stakes. He has since trained top-quality horses such as Master Willie, second in the 1980 Derby, Wind And Wuthering, winner of the 1981 Dewhurst Stakes, and Time Charter, who capped a golden period for Candy with four G1 victories - 1982 Investec Oaks & 1982 Champion Stakes, 1983 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond and 1984 Coronation Cup. Despite his proven ability to train middle-distance performers, it is sprinters, most of them bought cheaply, who have kept Candy in the limelight, such as 2002 Nunthorpe Stakes winner Kyllachy, 2002 Cheveley Park Stakes heroine Airwave, 2010 Haydock Sprint Cup victor Markab, 2015 Haydock Sprint Cup & 2016 Diamond Jubilee Stakes winner Twilight Son plus Limato, successful in the 2016 Darley July Cup and Prix de la Foret. He sent out 31 winners in Britain during 2017.

Harry Bentley

Born: June 10, 1992, Storrington, West Sussex. Educated at Dorset House & Eastbourne College. **Background:** started riding aged three and joined the Crawley and Horsham Pony Club at five. Trainer Gary Moore encouraged him to get an apprentice licence after finishing school at 16. Rode first winner on Moore-trained Prince Valentine at Lingfield, January 20, 2010. Burst on to the scene during the UAE season of 2011, with 17 winners as an apprentice. Rode as second jockey to Qatar Racing Ltd & Pearl Bloodstock in 2013 and 2014. Best British season with 60 wins in 2017. **Accolades/achievements:** Multiple champion jockey in Qatar, where his major victories include the Qatar Derby (2013 Dubday), Qatar Gold Cup (2014 Dubday) & H H The Emirs Trophy (2016 & 2018 The Blue Eye). **Other Major Wins include:** Darley July Cup (2016 Limato), Challenge Stakes (2017 Limato), Prix de la Foret (2016 Limato).

Royal Wedding namesakes to receive complimentary Grandstand entry on Al Shaqab Lockinge Day

Saturday, May 19, 2018, will mark a very special day in the Newbury calendar, not least because of the Royal nuptials which take place at Windsor Castle, a mere 35 miles down the road from the racecourse.

The G1 £350,000 Al Shaqab Lockinge Stakes, a race with its own Royal heritage, with the first two runnings (in 1958 & 1959) having been won by HM The Queen's Pall Mall, will see some of Europe's fastest thoroughbreds compete over a straight mile.

Racegoers can expect extra celebrations in honour of the Royal nuptials with gates opening at 11.00am and the Royal Wedding broadcast on big screens around the racecourse ahead of the live racing action which starts at 1.50pm.

After racing, all are welcome at our after-party in the Champagne Hall with a live DJ who will be sure to put together the ultimate wedding playlist or if live music is more your thing, head to the Copper King Bar marquee in the Grandstand Enclosure and listen to local Lambourn-based band, Uncovered, who regularly raise money for Racing Welfare.

Racegoers who share the names of the soon-to-be-wed Royal couple will be granted a complimentary Grandstand ticket to Newbury for Al Shaqab Lockinge Day if booking in advance.

Newbury Racecourse to support Mental Health Awareness Week at Al Shaqab Lockinge Day with Racing Welfare

Local Lambourn band 'Uncovered' prepare for their set at Newbury Racecourse on Saturday, May 19, wearing green ribbons in support of Mental Health Awareness Week

In support of Mental Health Awareness Week, Newbury Racecourse is working with Racing Welfare in its efforts across the industry to reduce the stigma surrounding mental health issues, promote the importance of good mental health and encourage open discussions on the subject as well as highlight the services that Racing Welfare can provide to support mental health.

All racecourse staff and stable staff will wear green ribbons on Al Shaqab Lockinge Day, Saturday, May 19, to raise awareness of the campaign in support of tackling the stigma associated with mental health issues.

Local Lambourn band and supporters of Racing Welfare, 'Uncovered', will also be performing live after racing and will show their support for Mental Health Awareness Week by adorning the green ribbons for their set which will take place in the Grandstand Enclosure.

Both lead singer Gracie O'Reilly and guitarist and founder, Shaun Johnson, work in the racing industry and earlier this year released a charity single in aid of Racing Welfare.

Shaun Johnson commented: "We are really looking forward to playing at Al Shaqab Lockinge Day, especially as Newbury is our local track. It is so important to raise awareness about mental health issues, not just across the racing industry and we will be playing our part by wearing the green ribbons on Saturday."

Mental Health Awareness week is a national campaign organised by the World Mental Health Foundation and runs from the 14th to the 20th May. Good mental health is not the absence of a mental health issue but someone's ability to cope with it. Nearly two thirds of the UK population have struggled with mental health issues at some time and the severity and ability to cope can fluctuate on a daily, weekly, yearly basis or across their life time.

Al Shaqab Lockinge Stakes - Facts & Figures

*The Al Shaqab Lockinge Stakes is the feature race, worth £350,000, on Newbury's richest Flat raceday which offers total prize money of £750,000.

*The Al Shaqab Lockinge Stakes' roll of honour includes some of the best horses to have graced the British turf, such as Brigadier Gerard (1972), Kris (1980), Selkirk (1992), Hawk Wing (2003) and Frankel (2012).

*Since the World's Best Racehorse Rankings (originally known as the International Classifications) were introduced in 1977, Frankel is the best racehorse there has been. He won the Al Shaqab Lockinge Stakes impressively by five lengths in 2012 and topped the rankings at the end of that year with an unprecedented rating of 140. Trained by Sir Henry Cecil, owned by Khalid Abdullah and ridden by Tom Queally, Frankel finished his racing career unbeaten in 14 races. He now stands as a stallion at Banstead Manor Stud in Newmarket. His first foal to be born, and to race, Cunco won on debut at Newbury the day before the Al Shaqab Lockinge Stakes in 2016.

*The great Brigadier Gerard, successful on 17 of his 18 starts, emulated (in 1972) his sire Queen's Hussar who captured the Al Shaqab Lockinge Stakes in 1963.

*Three horses have won the Al Shaqab Lockinge Stakes twice - Pall Mall in 1958 & 1959, Welsh Pageant in 1970 & 1971 and Soviet Line in 1995 & 1996.

*The most successful trainer in the Al Shaqab Lockinge Stakes is Sir Michael Stoute who has been victorious seven times. His first winner came with Scottish Reel in 1986, followed by Safawan (1990), Soviet Line (1995 & 1996), Medicean (2001), Russian Rhythm (2004) and Peeress (2006).

*Godolphin trainer Saeed Bin Suroor, responsible for five Al Shaqab Lockinge winners, has had 17 runners in the Al Shaqab Lockinge Stakes, the first being Charnwood Forest who finished runner-up in 1996.

*Richard Hannon has saddled two of the last four winners of the Al Shaqab Lockinge Stakes – Olympic Glory, who carried the colours of Al Shaqab to victory in 2014, his first year as a trainer, and the 2015 scorer Night Of Thunder.

*His father, Richard Hannon snr, won the Al Shaqab Lockinge Stakes three times - Swing Low (1993), Paco Boy (2010) and Canford Cliffs (2011).

*John Gosden, the Newmarket-based trainer, has been responsible for two Al Shaqab Lockinge Stakes victors – the Frankie Dettori-ridden Emperor Jones in 1994 and Virtual in 2009.

*Two Irish-trained horses have won - Bluerullah (1967) and the Aidan O'Brien-trained Hawk Wing (2003), who scored by a record 11 lengths.

*There have been three French-trained winners - El Rastro (1976), Polar Falcon (1991) and Carlos Laffon-Parias-trained Keltos (2002).

*The most successful jockey in the history of the Al Shaqab Lockinge Stakes has been the legendary Lester Piggott, victorious six times - 33 years spanned his first victory on Sovereign Path 1960 and his last on Swing Low in 1993. The ones in between were The Creditor (1964), Sparkler (1973), Belmont Bay (1981) and Polar Falcon (1991).

*Al Shaqab's retained jockey Frankie Dettori has had 16 rides in the Al Shaqab Lockinge Stakes. He has won the race four times - Emperor Jones (1994), Aljabr (2000), Creachadoir (2008) and Olympic Glory (2014).

*Olivier Peslier, who rode Keltos to victory, is the only French jockey to have succeeded in the race.

*The most successful owner in the history of the Al Shaqab Lockinge Stakes is Godolphin, whose eight successes have been delivered by Cape Cross (1998), Fly To The Stars (1999), Aljabr (2000), Creachadoir (2008), Farhh (2013), Night Of Thunder (2015), Belardo (2016) and Ribchester (2017). The first five horses were trained by Saeed bin Suroor, with the most recent handled by Richard Hannon, Roger Varian and Richard Fahey respectively.

*Cheveley Park Stud is the second most successful owner with five victories thanks to Scottish Reel (1986), Medicean (2001), Russian Rhythm (2004), Peeress (2006) and Virtual (2009). The stud's owners, David & Patricia Thompson, also scored with Safawan (1990) and Polar Falcon (1991).

*Rakti set the record for the fastest time in the history of the Al Shaqab Lockinge Stakes of 1m 33.59s in 2005.

*There were two winners of the Al Shaqab Lockinge Stakes in 1984, when Cormorant Wood and Wassl dead-heated.

*The Al Shaqab Lockinge Stakes has been won by less than a length on 22 occasions.

*There were 16 runners in the 2015 Al Shaqab Lockinge Stakes, the most to line up in the history of the race and one more than ran in 2004. There are 16 declared runners for the 2018 renewal.

*The number of runners in the Al Shaqab Lockinge Stakes has been in double figures on 20 occasions since contest was first staged in 1958.

*The lowest number of runners has been four. In 1958, The Queen's Pall Mall saw off three rivals to win the inaugural running, while there were also four runners in 1989 and 1991.

*The highest-priced winner of the Al Shaqab Lockinge Stakes has been Cape Cross (1998) at 20/1.

*In the history of the Al Shaqab Lockinge Stakes, 24 winners have started at a shorter price than 3/1.

*The favourite (or joint-favourite) has won 25 times in the 59 runnings of the Al Shaqab Lockinge Stakes.

*The age breakdown of the winners since the race became a Group One contest in 1995 is as follows:-

4-y-o – 15 successes

5-y-o – six successes

6-y-o – two successes

*Horses running in the Al Shaqab Lockinge Stakes carry 9st, with a 3lb allowance for fillies and mares.

*The last filly or mare to win the Al Shaqab Lockinge Stakes was Red Evie in 2007.

*The Al Shaqab Lockinge Stakes is part of the QIPCO British Champions Series, which incorporates the 35 top Flat races in the British horseracing calendar, and has been since the series started in 2011.

*The names of Al Shaqab Lockinge Stakes winners have started with 19 different letters of the alphabet – only G, I, J, L, U, X and Z have missed out.

£100,000 Al Rayyan Stakes (Group Three) 1m 4f

The Al Rayyan Stakes is for a race for older horses over a mile and half. It was promoted to Group Three status from Listed ranking before the 2016 renewal.

The first running as the Al Rayyan Stakes came in 2015 following the Al Shaqab sponsorship and the talented Telescope put up one of his best performances to beat the Qatari raider Dubday by six lengths. Dubday in turn franked the form by going on to win a G3 race at Goodwood.

The 2016 edition was notably for a surprise result, with 14/1 chance Astronereus coming out on top as the 4/6 favourite Even Top, trained by John Gosden and ridden by Frankie Dettori, flopped in fourth.

The 2017 renewal was won in impressive fashion by Charlie Appleby's Hawkbill, who justified 3/1 favouritism by two lengths. Hawkbill, owned by Godolphin, went on to success in the G2 Princess of Wales's Stakes at Newmarket in July, 2017 and the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic at Meydan, Dubai, in March 2018.
