Colonel Todd A. Sriver is Chief of the Nuclear Command, Control and Communications (NC3) Division, HQ USAF, Deputy Chief of Staff for Strategic Deterrence and Nuclear Integration. He leads a division of 20 personnel responsible for developing NC3 plans and policies; and advocating and integrating NC3 sustainment, modernization and recapitalization efforts to ensure credible and reliable NC3 capabilities for the President of the United States, national leadership, Combatant Commands, and USAF nuclear forces.

Col Sriver received his commission from Officer Training School in 1993. He has served as an aerospace engineer and operations research analyst at the Squadron, Center, Major Command, Air Staff, and Joint Staff levels. He has also commanded a Manpower Requirements Squadron. He holds a Bachelor's Degree in Aerospace Engineering, a Master's Degree and Ph.D. in Operations Research, and a Master's Degree in National Resource Strategy.
