Dear all,

I received a phone call not long ago from someone describing himself as a “Very Reform Jew.”



I asked him what he meant, and he shared that he never goes to services, he eats ham and cheese sandwiches, and he goes to the mother-in-law of his best friend's cousin for Passover seder every leap year.

OK, I concede this last example is a bit of an exaggeration. But only a bit...

I want to share what it truly means to be a “Very Reform Jew.” In short, it means that we are very committed to Reform Judaism. Below are the values I believe all Reform Jews should embrace:

- 1) Being a Reform Jew means we honor tradition while being receptive to change.
- 2) Being a Reform Jew means we include and embrace.
- 3) Being a Reform Jew means we believe in equality.
- 4) Being a Reform Jew means we want to leave the world better than how we found it.
- 5) Being a Reform Jew means we are seeking the Divine Voice in our lives.
- 6) Being a Reform Jew means we help Jewish communities locally and around the world.
- 7) Being a Reform Jew means we are committed to Israel's future.
- 8) Being a Reform Jew means we have a reason to want the next generation to continue to be Jews.
- 9) Being a Reform Jew means we study. The texts of our people belong to us. The Torah, the Talmud, the music, the liturgy... It doesn't belong only to the more deeply observant. It is ours to wrestle with, to debate, and to nurture.

Being a “Very Reform Jew” is so much more than being a secular modern progressive person. We are the bearers of a torch. We have inherited a symphony of voices. How will our own voice add to the chorus?

Go out and be a Very Reform Jew. Do it with pride! Do it with intention. Do it with conviction. And remember, if not now, when?

Hamilton: An American Musical is one of the most critically acclaimed and successful musicals in history. The story of an immigrant rising from poverty to becoming one of the United States founding fathers is one that has

universal appeal. Its groundbreaking model of music, utilizing rap, R&B and Broadway tunes has made it popular with every age group. I'm a huge musical fan and cannot remember in my lifetime a musical gaining such a tremendous following with such a wide range of people.

While the show does not speak of Alexander Hamilton's religious background, there are some scholars that believe that he had Jewish roots. Hamilton's father James A. Hamilton was Scottish and not Jewish. Some scholars believe that Hamilton's mother, Rachel Faucette, was likely Jewish. She was originally married to a man with the surname Lavien or Levine in modern times.

Because she never divorced her first husband, the Anglican Church saw Hamilton as illegitimate and banned him from its local school. Instead he studied at the local Jewish school run out of a Synagogue in Charlestown, the capital of Nevis. It was there that he learned Hebrew.

This year's Purim Shpiel blends the incredible raps and music of Hamilton with the story of Purim. The children in our Religious School's Purim Shpiel Chug have been working hard at learning their lines, raps and songs.

They are excited to debut the production of Esther: A Persian Musical, written by Cantor Jamie Marx. Please join us to watch this incredible production directed by Ben Goldberg and me.

The Shpiel will take place in Temple Akiba's Social Hall on Wednesday, February 28th at 6pm. Wear your costumes and stay after the show for Hamentashen!

Using Purim to Inspire Menschiness in Kids

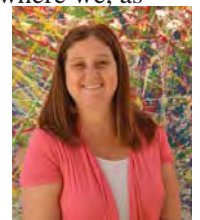
If you are a kid, Purim means costumes, hamantaschen, and probably a carnival. It means the one time of year where you are allowed to be as loud as you can in synagogue. The general craziness of the atmosphere can make Purim a favorite with a lot of little ones. If you are the parent of these kids, Purim can often mean over-tired, over-sugared, over-excited kids, which can be a challenge.

One of the lessons of Purim is *v'nahafochu* – everything turned upside down. It is an opportunity to celebrate the things that don't usually come out, to celebrate the moment when the Jews thought all hope was lost, only to learn that the world turned on its head and they were saved. It is also an opportunity for us to tease out some of the values of the Purim story – Esther's bravery, Mordechai's faith – and communicate them to our children. Particularly now, in a moment where kindness seems to be shrinking every day, we can turn the world upside down by doubling down on love.

Let's start with the first of the purim *mitzvot*, gifts for the poor—*matanot l'evyonim*. In this moment of Purim, where we celebrate and revel in being saved, we also remember that there are those around us who don't have what we have. We are commanded to feed the poor on Purim— in fact, we are told to immediately say yes to any person who asks for money. What better lesson for our children than to learn than to give to those that have less.

The second mitzvah of Purim is *mishloach manot*, giving gifts, usually of food, to family and friends. *Mishloach manot* are a way to help our kids exercise the "giving muscle." We can help our children practice going up to friends and family, looking them in the eye, offering a gift with a smile and trying to glean a reward from the other person's gratitude. We can practice giving without expecting anything in return and we can practice being thankful if a gift does come our way.

Now, the final mitzvah is to drink to the point where you don't know the difference between Haman and Mordechai and by extension, between good and evil. Leaving the drinking aside, we can think about it this way; this is where we, as parents come in. In a time when our fellow citizens cannot even agree on basic facts, it becomes our obligation to draw lines in the sand for our children before the holiday begins. It becomes our job to teach them good and evil, right and wrong, moral and immoral. In a time when people seem to have trouble knowing the difference, the best way to do this particular Purim mitzvah is to make sure we are communicating that difference clearly and without hesitation to our children.

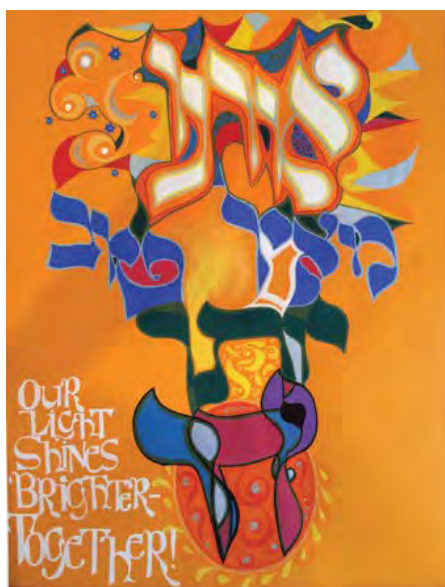
