Message from the Pastor

Recently, in the e-Spire, I mentioned that there will be times in your life when you feel closer to God and times in your life when you feel further away from God. This is normal for any relationship. And, as it is, faith is primarily a relationship with God. So what do you do with any relationship when you feel estranged — whether it's a spouse, a family member or a friend? Hopefully you work on it. Spend time in conversation, go out to dinner, take long walks where there are no distractions pulling you in different directions. The same applies to faith. It takes work sometimes - an intentional effort on your part to stay connected with God: daily prayer, worship, study, service, fellowship, etc.

When John Wesley was struggling in his faith, a Moravian friend of his told him, "Preach faith till you have it; and then, because you have it, you will preach faith." It was beautiful advice, which worked, and which eventually led the young man Wesley to his conversion experience.

There are many seasons throughout the Christian year to renew the Covenant promise. September is one of those seasons. It marks a cultural new year with back-to-school events and activities. Along with back to school, I invite you to come back to church, back to God, and back to faith. God was never absent. God has always been there, but now is an opportunity for you to rediscover that relationship with God. In that rediscovery, you will be renewed, refreshed and rejuvenated for the road ahead, which, without your awareness of God on it, can be and feel very lonely.

During the month of September, we are celebrating our **Vision: Love as Jesus Loves** and our **Mission: Love God, Love One Another and Make Disciples of Jesus Christ**. You're encouraged to come join us as we rejoice in these wonderful things. September 11th will be a big Sunday with several things going on, including an all-church family picnic, blessing of the backpacks and inflatable fun and games for the young at heart. 
WESLEY CHOIR






