ADMINISTRATIVE COUNCIL NOTES FOR MAY 22, 2017

Board of Trustees, Craig Schmid - President:

- Carol Sherman reviewed the 2017 BAUMC scholarships
- Seven students will receive scholarships of \$800 each
- The committee will interview two applicants for the Pay It Forward scholarship
- The Trustees approved entering into an agreement with Rexel/BGE to replace all (~400) of the fluorescent light fixtures in the facility with LED fixtures. Rexel will provide the fixtures, BGE will pay Rexel the rebate at the completion of the work and BAUMC's cost will be ~ \$4,600
- The Trustees approved signing up for roadside assistance for our church bus and truck for a total cost of \$190/year
- Reviewed plans for a capital campaign (see below)

Finance Committee, Bill Uebersax - Chair

- Reviewed the April YTD financial report. Expenses are about where they should be and income is a little bit behind – neither of which is unusual for this time of the year
- Our Treasurer, Sue Henry will be leaving the area and will be missed
- Jim Aberle will be joining the Finance Committee (not as a replacement for Sue)
- The 2016 audit report is nearly complete and will be presented at the June meeting
- Bev Jenkins reviewed the counting procedures with the Finance Committee

Capital Campaign, Dave Greenwood - Chair

- A group of folks have been working on early planning for a BAUMC capital campaign to fund a number of important capital projects. The campaign theme is "Tune Up To Praise" and will be focused on various upgrades and enhancements to our worship spaces. These will include long awaited repairs and modifications to the Sanctuary pipe organ, audio/visual enhancements for the Sanctuary and McComas Hall, projects focused on protecting the worship spaces and other projects focused on enhancing the audio/visual capabilities in our class rooms, meeting rooms and common spaces.
- The main part of the capital campaign will be conducted in September and October with our annual stewardship campaign in November and December.

Thank You to Rosedale Federal - We received a \$5,000 donation for our Family Food Ministries from Rosedale Federal. Since the start of the food ministry, they have donated \$30,000. Thanks be to God!

Boy Scouts

Since 1953, Bel Air United Methodist church has been the Charter Organization of Boy Scout Troop 777 with a strong and healthy relationship founded on the mission to prepare young people to make ethical and moral choices over their lifetimes by instilling in them the values of the Scout Oath and Law.

During that time many scouts have gone on to become Eagle Scouts, in fact 121 and counting! One of the Eagle rank requirements is to plan, develop, and give leadership to others in a service project helpful to any religious institution, school, or community. Through this requirement, Scouts practice what they have learned and gain valuable project management and leadership experience.

Since the leadership of former scoutmaster (20+ years) and current church member Jack Potter and continuing now under the tenure of the current scoutmaster since 2007 (and also church member), Greg Wheeler, there has been a focus to continue to foster that relationship with many of these Eagle scouts selecting to complete an Eagle project here at BAUMC which will benefit the church in many different ways. Here are just a few recent examples to spotlight over the past few years:

2009 – J. Wheeler – brick paver (inscribed) pathway up to prayer pond

2010 – Z. Wheeler – brick paver (inscribed) pathway around remaining portion of pond and solid (inscribed) marble bench

2011 – N. Gardner – installed underground drainage to half of the front of church to alleviate flooding problems to classrooms

2012 – M. Gardner – completed underground drainage and installation of diverter to continue to address water issues in downstairs rooms

2013 – J. Caudill – addition of flag pole at corner of church driveway

2014 – D. Dyer – removal and replacement of church sign on front lawn at Linwood Circle entrance

2015 - K. Bittle – addition of GA-GA ball pit (Octagon by Food Ministry building – Ga-ga is a Hebrew word (גא-גא) for touch-touch which is a variant of dodgeball that is played with one ball in the “pit”.

2016 – N. Wilcox – addition of fire pit and collapsible benches at the top of the hill behind Homestead property and sheds

2017 – J. McCutcheon – brick paver ring around flag pole (2013 project)

The troop looks forward to many more years of projects and volunteer opportunities with Bel Air United Methodist church and the great reverent direction they provide.

Girl Scout Troop 2- Twelve Scouts Earned Bronze Award. They wanted to have a project with a lasting, positive effect on their community. A troop friend mentioned how it would be nice to see more birds in the community. After researching birds more, it was learned the Eastern Bluebird population has declined greatly due to the increase of building and housing developments. The decision was made to build and install nesting boxes to create a bluebird nesting trail to encourage the revitalization of the birds. On Saturday, April 15th, each girl brought their finished nesting box and worked in pairs to install them. Throughout the project, the girls learned the

importance of community support as they recruited many volunteers and sponsors who helped them achieve their award. They had the opportunity to work with local bird experts including Bob Turner from Wild Birds Unlimited and Mary Murray from the Harford Bird Club who also served as project mentors. Going forward, the troop members will maintain and monitor the boxes, collecting data on the local bird population.
