From our Assistant Rector

Creating a Rule of Life.

That should sound familiar to a lot of you by now, since we've been talking about it for over a month; it was our Wednesday Night Program for the season of Easter. Does it sound imposing? It might, but it shouldn't. A Rule of Life is essentially a covenant you make with yourself to help you keep your life balanced and focused. It's meant to be individual and fluid, and should change with you.


I wrote my first Rule of Life when I was in seminary; we devoted an entire class to learning about and developing them (among other things) and in the end mine was relatively short, but focused. I committed to spending time each day with Ben that was just for us, praying together as a family aside from saying grace, starting each morning with meditative prayer using my prayer beads, and going for a walk at least three times a week. There might have been more on my Rule, but I don't remember now. I can't say that I held to it 100%; there were days or weeks when I missed something. But having it written down, knowing that I had made a promise to myself and my relationships to do these things...it made a difference.

Life is distracting. It's busy, stressful, consuming. Even with the best intentions, things are forgotten or pushed to the side for something that is inevitably more important. What's more, it's nearly always the things we want to do for *ourselves* that get put off. Or if you're like me, when you lead an on-the-go life and you get a bit of down time, vegging out in front of the TV and turning off your mind is oh so tempting. The last thing you want to do in those moments is more work.

Which is why your Rule of Life shouldn't list things that feel like work. They should challenge you, yes, but ultimately reward you and be things that you look forward to doing. My own Rule isn't complete yet, but I will tell you that I've added coloring to it. I discovered, on a new clergy retreat, that, for me, coloring is relaxing and stimulating - have you seen some of those awesome adult coloring books? It opens my mind and brings me peace, helps me think...and if I don't have it written down as a spiritual discipline, that's one "treat" that I'll never do on my own, despite the fact that it's really good for me.

I'm attaching a [link here to a worksheet](#) for you to get started on your own Rule of Life, and I hope you'll do it. If you have questions or still aren't sure where to start, just ask me! I'm happy to talk it over with you.

In addition to mixed paper, cardboard, steel and aluminum cans and glass bottles, the City of Virginia Beach will now accept all plastic bottles #1 through #7 as well as all empty food and beverage cartons including: milk, juice, soy milk, soup, broth, egg substitutes, cream, and wine. Pentecost... is...

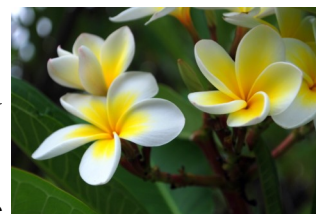
- one of the first festivals celebrated by Christians along with Easter. It was celebrated before Christmas and is considered one of the three most important feasts of our year, along with Easter and Christmas.
- 50 days after Easter Sunday, hence "pente;" remembers the giving of the Holy Spirit and formation of the Christian Church (sometimes thought of as the birthday of the Church).
- paralleling the Jewish harvest "feast of weeks," which was thanksgiving for the giving of the Law and formation of community on Sinai.
- RED, reminding of the tongues of fire and the offering of lives of the martyrs of the Church.
- symbolized by a dove which was seen at the baptism of Jesus and used by artists for centuries to represent the Holy Spirit.
- sometimes called "WhitSunday" in the old English tradition because it is one of the most appropriate days for baptisms and confirmations ~ the people or infants coming for baptism would wear white.
