




Thank you for your purchase today, it really makes a difference for this woman and her family in Nicaragua.

Hilda visited the office to ask for the English-class when she read the advertising sign about The Paper Quilling Class and got interested. All info regarding the class was provided to her and decided to get involved.



Hilda attended two classes only which was enough for her to learn the basic technique and is now reproducing what she learned and had developed her own line of business making nice gift paper bags. Hilda saw a great opportunity and took the chance since she evaluated that C\$50 cordobas was less than a symbolic payment for the advantage and went on and took the class.

Hilda had never taken such a class before in any other center or craft school, not because she did not want to, but because of the high cost. Also, she said that symbolic payment was not even a payment for the class since that money was basically used to pay for her materials to get this new knowledge in crafts.

Once she acquired the knowledge her immediate step was to get her own tools to work from home.
