Matthew 7:12 is the Golden Rule. It is also the second Bible verse that I memorized as a little boy, and in the King James, no less. To this day, when quoting it, I still quote the KJV, "Whatsoever ye would that men should do to you, do ye even so unto them." On face value, this simply means, treat others as you want to be treated. This is a simple and yet profound truth. Simple because we all know how we personally want to be treated. Profound because in our humanity, in a moment of frustration, stress, anger, fear, or even righteous indignation it is easy to treat others in a way that we do not want to be treated.
